# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO POLICING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public trust in law 2 enforcement is critical to ensuring justice for all under the 3 law. The legislature further finds that data collection is one 4 essential tool to allow the public, police, and policymakers to 5 analyze the effectiveness of existing practices, determine which 6 policies work and do not work, and support policy decisions with 7 clear and relevant data.

8 Numerous states and the District of Columbia have enacted 9 laws to standardize the collection of complete and accurate 10 policing stop data to increase community trust, transparency, 11 and internal accountability for public safety through data 12 analysis. Similarly, in 2020, Hawaii enacted Act 47, Session 13 Laws of Hawaii 2020, to standardize best practices for the use 14 of force between the counties.

15 The purpose of this Act is to enhance the public's trust in 16 law enforcement and continue to standardize best practices for 17 the data collection of police stops, arrests, and use of force

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1	between the counties in Hawaii by requiring each county police			
2	department to collect, report, and publicly publish certain data			
3	regarding police stops, arrests, uses of force, and trends.			
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 52D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
6	and to read as follows:			
7	" <u>§52D-</u> Police stops; arrests; uses of force; data			
8	collection; report to legislature. (a) The chief of each			
9	county police department shall submit to the legislature no			
10	later than January 31 of each year an annual report with a			
11	summary of data and visual displays, including but not limited			
12	to graphs and charts, relating to police stops, arrests, uses of			
13	force, and trends relating to police stops, arrests, and uses of			
14	force. The reporting period of each report shall be from			
15	January 1 to December 31 of the year immediately before the year			
16	of the report submission.			
17	(b) The report shall include data concerning:			
18	(1) All police stops, including the following information:			
19	(A) The total number of stops;			
20	(B) The date, time, location, and approximate			
21	duration of the stop;			



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1	(C) The reason for the initial stop;
2	(D) Whether a search was conducted as a result of the
3	stop, and, if a search was conducted:
4	(i) The reason for the search;
5	(ii) Whether the search was consensual or
6	nonconsensual;
7	(iii) Whether person, property, or both was
8	searched; and
9	(iv) Whether contraband or property was seized
10	during the search;
11	(E) The final outcome of the stop, including whether:
12	(i) A warning was issued, and if so, the reasons
13	for the warning;
14	(ii) A citation was issued, and if so, the
15	citation charged; and
16	(iii) An arrest was made, and if so, the criminal
17	offense or offenses charged;
18	(F) The total number of persons involved in the stop;
19	(G) The age, race, ethnicity, and sex or perceived
20	age, race, ethnicity, and sex of each person
21	involved in the stop;

4	(2)	All arrests, including the following information:
5		(A) The total number of arrests;
6		(B) The case number, date, time, location, and
7		approximate duration of the arrest;
8		(C) The reason for the arrest;
9		(D) Whether a search was conducted as a result of the
10		arrest, and, if a search was conducted:
11		(i) The reason for the search;
12		(ii) Whether the search was consensual or
13		nonconsensual;
14		(iii) Whether person, property, or both was
15		searched; and
16		(iv) Whether contraband or property was seized
17		during the search;
18		(E) The charged offense or offenses;
19		(F) The final disposition of the case;
20		(G) The total number of persons involved in the
21		arrest;

4	(c) The chief of each county police department shall post
5	a copy of the report submitted to the legislature pursuant to
6	this section on the department's website on an annual basis.
7	(d) The chief of each county policy department shall
8	establish and maintain an online repository in a searchable
9	format for the policing data collection of aggregate and
10	disaggregate information that is accessible to the public on the
11	department's website.
12	(e) The chief of each county police department shall
13	retain the electronic and paper records relating to policing
14	stops, arrests, and uses of force in accordance with law, the
15	department's record retention policy, or at least five years
16	after the annual report is submitted, whichever period is
17	longer.
18	(f) For the purposes of this section, "stop" means a
19	temporary investigation detention of a person for the purpose of
20	determining whether probable cause exists to make an arrest. A
21	"stop" is a seizure of an individual's person and occurs

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1	whenever an officer uses the officer's authority to compel a
2	person to halt or remain in a certain place."
3	SECTION 3. Section 52D-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending its title to read as follows:
5	"§52D-3.5 [ <del>Reports</del> ] <u>Annual report</u> to legislature[-] <u>of</u>
6	misconduct incidents."
7	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on December 1, 2023
