## H.B. NO. <sup>975</sup> H.D. 2

### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of cover 1 crops, green manure, and compost increases agricultural 2 productivity and aligns with the State's integrated 3 4 sustainability goals. Plants used for this purpose, including 5 grasses, legumes, and forbs, add nutrients to the soil, act as 6 windbreaks, assist with water retention, provide habitats for 7 beneficial insects, and help prevent soil erosion. 8 The legislature further finds that it is in the interest of 9 the State to incentivize the use of management practices that

10 enhance the quality and sustainability of Hawaii's agricultural 11 lands.

12 The purpose of this Act is to clarify the requirements for 13 participation under the cover crop reimbursement pilot program. 14 SECTION 2. Act 312, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, section 15 2, is amended as follows:

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1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:

1 "(d) If an application is approved, funds shall be 2 disbursed upon approval by the department of agriculture on an annual basis to the farmer or rancher for up to seventy-five per 3 cent of the costs incurred for cover crop seeds, green manure, 4 or compost purchased after June 30, 2022, but before July 1, 5 6 2025. The department of agriculture shall publicly post any 7 grant awarded under the cover crop reimbursement pilot program. 8 The department of agriculture shall convene a review (e) 9 panel to be placed within the department of agriculture 10 comprising knowledgeable representatives from the department of 11 agriculture, University of Hawaii at Manoa college of tropical 12 agriculture and human resources, and industry organizations. 13 The review panel shall screen and rate applicants on the quality 14 and appropriate use of their cover crops and green manure and 15 their composting practices. The department of agriculture shall 16 aggregate the total reimbursement applications pursuant to this 17 section and distribute the available moneys based on a ranking 18 scale as determined by the review panel; provided that a higher-19 ranked applicant shall receive a higher rate of reimbursement 20 than a lower-ranked applicant."
