HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TELEHEALTH WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE IMPACT OF WIDESPREAD TELEHEALTH ADOPTION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND IDENTIFY PUBLIC POLICY INITIATIVES AT THE FEDERAL AND STATE LEVEL TO OPTIMIZE TELEHEALTH UTILIZATION AS THE STATE TRANSITIONS OUT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

1 WHEREAS, the State experienced an increase in the use of 2 telehealth during the COVID-19 pandemic by a factor of sixty-3 five and has remained at that level, which is well above the 4 pre-COVID-19 pandemic usage; and

6 WHEREAS, telehealth adoption was most significant with 7 direct-to-consumer video visits on personal devices and audio-8 only telephone visits, often without important elements of the 9 physical exam or vital signs being obtained during the visit; 10 and

12 WHEREAS, although there is some data to support the safety, 13 efficacy, timeliness, access, and cost effectiveness of 14 telehealth, the impact of widespread telehealth adoption in the 15 State is largely unknown; and

WHEREAS, although telehealth (video and audio) visits may improve short term access to and timeliness of health care, there may be adverse long-term consequences if patients are not seen in person for physical examination, lab work, vital signs, and other in-clinic testing; and

WHEREAS, a full evaluation of the impact of widespread telehealth adoption in the State on safety, utilization, total cost of care, and patient and provider satisfaction to determine how best to integrate telehealth into in-person practice as the State transitions out of the COVID-19 pandemic would provide the



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1 State with greater insight into existing telehealth challenges and benefits; and 2 3 WHEREAS, state agencies, health care systems, insurance 4 payers, and private organizations in the State individually have 5 incomplete access to health care utilization, safety, and cost 6 7 data, so no single organization can fully and accurately study the impact of telehealth in the State; now, therefore, 8 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that a Telehealth 12 Working Group is requested to be established to examine the 13 impact of widespread telehealth adoption during the COVID-19 14 pandemic and identify public policy initiatives at the federal 15 16 and state level to optimize telehealth utilization as the State transitions out of the COVID-19 pandemic; and 17 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Telehealth Working Group is 20 requested to consist of the following members: 21 22 (1)The Director of Health, or the Director's designee, 23 who shall serve as co-chairperson of the the working 24 group; 25 26 (2) A representative from the Healthcare Association of 27 Hawaii, who shall serve as co-chairperson of the working group; 28 29 (3) The Insurance Commissioner, or the Insurance 30 31 Commissioner's designee; 32 The Administrator of the Med-QUEST Division of the 33 (4) 34 Department of Human Services, or the Administrator's 35 designee; 36 37 (5) A representative from the Professional and Vocational 38 Licensing Division of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, to be appointed by the Licensing 39 administrator of the Professional and Vocational 40 41 Licensing Division; 42 43 A representative of the Pacific Basin Telehealth (6) 44 Resource Center of the University of Hawaii at Manoa,
