
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REQUIRE STUDENTS TO
COMPLETE AND PASS THE CIVICS PORTION OF THE UNITED STATES
CITIZENSHIP TEST IN ORDER TO GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL OR
OBTAIN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA.

1 WHEREAS, a basic understanding of United States civics and
2 history is essential to becoming actively engaged citizens; and

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4 WHEREAS, in 2015 Arizona became the first state to require
5 high school students to pass the United States citizenship test
6 on civics before they can graduate; and

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8 WHEREAS, the questions listed on the high school test are
9 identical to the civics portion of the naturalization test
10 administered by the United States Citizenship and Immigration
11 Services; and

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13 WHEREAS, the test questions cover various topics in United
14 States history, government, and the Constitution of the United
15 States; and

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17 WHEREAS, several other states joined Arizona in requiring
18 students to pass the test in order to graduate; and

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20 WHEREAS, promoting civic education encourages Hawaii's
21 youth to stay informed and engaged; now, therefore,

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23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
24 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
25 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
26 Education is urged to require students to complete and pass the
27 civics portion of the United States citizenship test in order to
28 graduate from high school or obtain a high school diploma; and
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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Department of Education is
2 requested to provide all students, beginning with students
3 entering the ninth grade, with an opportunity to take the test
4 at least once per school year and allow them to repeat the test
5 as often as necessary to demonstrate proficiency; and

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7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of
9 Education, Chairperson of the Board of Education, and President
10 of the Hawaii State Teachers Association.
