## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO SUBMIT A GRANT REQUEST TO THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY FOR ROCKFALL MITIGATION IN MOANALUA GARDENS AND MOANALUA VALLEY, OAHU.

WHEREAS, boulders along hillsides pose a threat of 1 2 dangerous rockfalls and landslides that could directly and indirectly impact communities across the State; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, rockfall mitigation projects require proactive measures to protect hillside and valley communities; and 6 7 WHEREAS, on Oahu, the Moanalua Gardens and Moanalua Valley 8 communities are considered a high-risk zone for landslides and 9 10 rockfalls; and 11 12 WHEREAS, certain hillsides surrounding Moanalua Valley are owned by the federal government, such as Tripler Army Medical 13 Center; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the United States Army Corps of Engineers has 16 previously conducted rockfall mitigation projects on surrounding 17 hillsides in Moanalua Gardens and Moanalua Valley; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency is responsible for planning for and responding to natural and 21 human-caused emergencies in the State; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 25 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii 26 27 Emergency Management Agency is requested to identify and submit a request for an appropriate grant, including but not limited to 28 a hazard mitigation assistance grant or pre-disaster mitigation 29 30 program grant, to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for





rockfall mitigation in Moanalua Gardens and Moanalua Valley, Oahu, under the Tripler Army Medical Center hillside; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commander of the United States Army Corps of Engineers, Honolulu District; Adjutant General; and Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency.
