HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING ALEXANDER & BALDWIN, INC., TO RESTORE AND REOPEN THE PALI LANES BOWLING CENTER.

1 WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Hawaii recognizes 2 the value of conserving and developing the historic and cultural 3 property within the State for the public good; and 4

5 WHEREAS, section 6E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, states that 6 the historic and cultural heritage of the State is among its 7 important assets and that the rapid social and economic 8 development of contemporary society threaten to destroy the 9 remaining vestiges of this heritage; and

WHEREAS, in section 6E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Legislature further declares that it is in the public interest to engage in a comprehensive program of historic preservation at all levels of government to promote the use and conservation of historic and cultural property for the education, inspiration, pleasure, and enrichment of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, section 6E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, also states 18 that it shall be the public policy of the State to provide 19 20 leadership in preserving, restoring, and maintaining historic and cultural property, to ensure the administration of such 21 historic and cultural property in a spirit of stewardship and 22 trusteeship for future generations, and to conduct activities, 23 plans, and programs in a manner consistent with the preservation 24 and enhancement of historic and cultural property; and 25 26

WHEREAS, the Pali Lanes bowling center opened in Kailua in
1961 where it served as a pillar of community, social life, and
entertainment for the residents of Windward Oahu until it was
forced to permanently shut its doors in 2021 as a result of the
economic downturn that followed the COVID-19 outbreak; and

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1 2 WHEREAS, Pali Lanes was listed on the Hawaii Register of Historic Places in 2018 as a historically significant site on 3 4 the local level for its associations with the development of bowling in Hawaii during the 1950s and 1960s and for serving as 5 a good example of mid-century modern design applied to a bowling 6 7 center; and 8 9 WHEREAS, prior to its closure, Pali Lanes was one of only three privately owned bowling centers from the post-war period 10 in Hawaii to remain in operation and the only such bowling 11 12 center to service the Windward side of Oahu; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the restrictions on businesses and other public 15 places that were put in place to manage the spread of COVID-19 16 have in large part been lifted, allowing businesses to operate 17 and provide their services to the public; and 18 19 WHEREAS, a 2018 survey of 4,490 Kailua residents found that 20 fifty-six percent of respondents favored maintaining Pali Lanes 21 and the surrounding area as it was, while only eighteen percent of respondents expressed opposition to such an option; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the current owner of the Pali Lanes property, 24 Alexander & Baldwin, Inc., is presently exploring options for 25 26 the redevelopment and possible future use of the Pali Lanes 27 property; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that Alexander & 31 32 Baldwin, Inc., is urged to restore and reopen the Pali Lanes 33 bowling center; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon restoring and reopening 36 the Pali Lanes bowling center, Alexander & Baldwin, Inc., is 37 urged to manage the Pali Lanes property in a manner consistent 38 with the State's policy to promote the use and conservation of 39 historic properties for the education, inspiration, pleasure, and enrichment of its citizens; and 40 41
