

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY TO CREATE GREEN SPACES FOR FOOD PRODUCTION, CULTURAL ACTIVITIES, AND CLIMATE RESILIENCE; CONSIDER ACTIONS THAT ALLOW FOR IN-GROUND PLANTING, RESIDENT USE OF GREEN SPACES, FACILITATED COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT, SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE, AND CLIMATE-RESILIENT LANDSCAPES; AND CONSIDER THE PROVISION OF TECHNICAL AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Public Housing Authority's policies 1 prohibit in-ground planting and restrict access to underutilized 2 green spaces; and 3 4 WHEREAS, public housing residents should be empowered to 5 utilize green spaces for food production, cultural activities, 6 and the development of climate-resilient and welcoming natural 7 8 spaces; and 9 WHEREAS, such utilization of green spaces can enhance 10 community resilience, foster cultural preservation, promote 11 sustainable food systems, and contribute to environmental 12 13 stewardship; and 14 WHEREAS, this body recognizes the importance of community-15 driven initiatives in fostering a sense of ownership and 16 stewardship over local environments; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 20 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Public 21 Housing Authority is encouraged to create green spaces for food 22 production, cultural activities, and climate resilience; 23 consider actions that allow for in-ground planting, resident use 24 of green spaces, facilitated community engagement, sustainable 25



1 agriculture, and climate-resilient landscapes; and consider the 2 provision of technical and financial assistance; and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Public Housing 4 5 Authority is requested to undertake the necessary actions to implement the recommendations outlined in this measure, in 6 collaboration with community organizations, local stakeholders, 7 project residents, and indigenous communities; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Public Housing 10 Authority is urged to create opportunities for residents to use 11 green spaces to grow food, conduct cultural activities, and 12 13 develop climate-resilient and welcoming natural spaces; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; 16 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture; Executive Director of 17 18 the Hawaii Public Housing Authority; University of Hawaii at Manoa College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources 19 Cooperative Extension; Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and 20 21 Adaptation Commission; and county boards or departments of 22 water.
