HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE RELEVANT STATE LAWS GOVERNING AGRICULTURAL-BASED COMMERCIAL OPERATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, Act 113, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012 (Act 113), expanded the list of authorized activities in agricultural 2 districts to include agricultural-based commercial operations, 3 which allows for the display and sale of agricultural products 4 grown in the State, value-added products that were produced 5 using agricultural products grown in the State, food using 6 products grown in the State or value-added products produced 7 using agricultural products grown in the State, and logo items 8 9 related to the producer's agricultural operations; and 10 WHEREAS, the intent of Act 113 was to enable bona fide 11 agricultural producers to remain profitable and continue to farm 12 in the State by allowing producers to have additional income 13 14 streams; and 15 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 205-2(d)(15), Hawaii Revised 16 17 Statutes, agricultural-based commercial operations include roadside stands, limited retail activities in an enclosed 18 structure owned and operated by an agricultural producer, 19 certain retail food establishments, farmers' markets, and food 20 hubs; and 21 22 WHEREAS, there is currently no requirement that an 23 agricultural-based commercial operation display or sell a 24 product produced on the subject property, only that they display 25 or sell products grown somewhere in the State; and 26 27 WHEREAS, this lack of nexus between the product sold by the 28 agricultural-based commercial operation and the subject land 29 allows for the abuse of the intent of Act 113, and may impede 30 enforcement of state laws regulating agricultural-based 31 commercial operations; and 32



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1 2 WHEREAS, as an example of this type of abuse of existing laws, a conditional use permit, which is now involved in a 3 contested case, was granted to a landowner of fallow 4 5 agricultural land to open three businesses, one to sell coffee and tea, one to sell sandwiches and pizza, and one to sell 6 7 distilled products; and 8 9 WHEREAS, as an additional example of this type of abuse of 10 existing laws, a conditional use permit, which is now involved in a contested case, to operate a zipline business was granted 11 to a landowner in exchange for locating a few dozen sheep on a 12 13 small portion of a large agricultural parcel; and 14 15 WHEREAS, at the February 7, 2024, hearing by the House Standing Committee on Agriculture on House Bill No. 2737, the 16 Department of Agriculture acknowledged that there is potential 17 18 for abuse of the intent of the laws regulating agricultural-19 based commercial operations; and 20 21 WHEREAS, representatives from the Department of Agriculture and relevant stakeholders have expressed an openness to 22 23 participate in a review of the effectiveness and deficiencies of the laws regulating agricultural-based commercial operations; 24 now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 27 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 28 Session of 2024, that the Department of Agriculture is requested 29 to convene a working group to review the effectiveness of the 30 relevant State laws governing agricultural-based commercial 31 operations; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in convening the working group, 34 the Department of Agriculture is requested to invite relevant 35 stakeholders and agencies to participate in the working group, 36 including but not limited to: 37 38 39 (1) County planning and agricultural departments; 40 (2) The Land Use Commission; 41 42
