
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO DECLARE A CYBER HARASSMENT AND
CYBERBULLYING AWARENESS DAY.

1 WHEREAS, a significant rise in cyber harassment and
2 cyberbullying has occurred in the last ten years as a result of
3 national and international internet usage increasing
4 exponentially; and

5
6 WHEREAS, the Pew Research Center found that forty-one
7 percent of Americans have experienced some form of cyber
8 harassment, including physical threats, stalking, sustained
9 harassment, sexual harassment, offensive name-calling, and
10 purposeful embarrassment; and

11
12 WHEREAS, online harassment related to political views has
13 increased over time, with twenty percent of Americans reporting
14 experiencing online harassment because of their political views
15 in 2020, compared to fourteen percent in 2017; and

16
17 WHEREAS, women and minority groups are more likely to be
18 targets of cyber harassment as a result of their racial and
19 gender identity; and

20
21 WHEREAS, seventy-nine percent of Americans believe that
22 social media companies are doing either a poor or fair job of
23 addressing cyber harassment complaints; and

25 WHEREAS, the State has not adequately addressed the growing
26 issue of cyber harassment and cyberbullying; now, therefore,

28 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
29 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
30 Session of 2024, that the Governor is requested to declare a
31 Cyber Harassment and Cyberbullying Awareness Day; and
