## HOUSE RESOLUTION

EMPOWERING RESIDENTS' SOVEREIGNTY OVER GREEN SPACES FOR FOOD PRODUCTION, CULTURAL ACTIVITIES, AND CLIMATE RESILIENCE.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's land use policy currently prohibits in-1 ground planting and restricts access to underutilized green 2 spaces; and 3 4 WHEREAS, there exists a need to empower residents to 5 utilize green spaces for food production, cultural 6 activities, and the development of climate resilient and 7 welcoming natural environments; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, such utilization of green spaces can enhance community resilience, foster cultural preservation, promote 11 sustainable food systems, and contribute to environmental 12 stewardship; and 13 14 WHEREAS, recognizing the importance of community-driven 15 initiatives in fostering a sense of ownership and 16 stewardship over local environments; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED that the Hawaii State Legislature recommends the following changes to land use policy: 20 21 1. Repeal Prohibitions on In-Ground Planting: Amend 22 existing land use regulations to remove prohibitions 23 on in-ground planting within designated green spaces. 24 25 2. Grant Residents Sovereignty Over Green Spaces: 26 Establish a new policy framework granting residents 27 sovereignty over underutilized green spaces, 28 29 empowering them to engage in activities such as food production, cultural events, and the development of 30 31 climate resilient landscapes. 32

Facilitate Community Engagement and Participation: Implement mechanisms for community consultation and participation in the management and decision-making processes regarding the use of green spaces, ensuring inclusivity and representation from diverse stakeholders.

14 15 16 17 18 19	5. Support Cultural Preservation and Education: Foster initiatives that promote the preservation and celebration of indigenous cultures, traditional knowledge, and practices related to land stewardship and food production.
20 21 22 23 24	<ol> <li>Provide Technical and Financial Assistance: Allocate resources to support residents in accessing technical assistance, funding opportunities, and educational programs aimed at enhancing their capacity to utilize green spaces effectively and sustainably.</li> </ol>
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii State Legislature directs relevant governmental agencies and departments to undertake the necessary actions to implement the recommendations outlined in this resolution, in collaboration with community organizations, local stakeholders, and indigenous communities. ; and
33         34         35         36         37         38         39         40         41	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Public Housing Authority is urged to create a new land use policy which gives residents sovereignty over these green spaces to grow food, conduct cultural activities, and develop climate resilient and welcoming natural spaces.



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 1 2 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of Hawaii, the Hawaii Public Housing Authority, relevant community 3 organizations, and other stakeholders for their 4 5 consideration and implementation.
