HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PASS THE "PROTECTING AMERICANS FROM FOREIGN ADVERSARY CONTROLLED APPLICATIONS ACT" TO DIVEST OWNERSHIP OF TIKTOK OR BE SUBJECT TO A NATIONWIDE BAN.

1 WHEREAS, the popular video-sharing platform, TikTok, boasts one hundred seventy million United States users, including forty 2 3 per cent of the nation's mobile internet users; and 4 5 WHEREAS, TikTok poses serious national security concerns 6 due to its ties with the Chinese Communist Party; and 7 8 WHEREAS, TikTok's parent company, ByteDance, is headquartered in Beijing, China, and under Chinese law, 9 companies operating in China are compelled to share their data 10 with the government upon request; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Director of the United States Federal Bureau 13 of Investigation has warned that the Chinese Communist Party 14 could harness the application to influence American users or 15 16 control or otherwise compromise software on millions of electronic devices: and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, ByteDance has refused to cease the flow of data to 20 the Chinese government despite requests from the United States Committee on Foreign Investment to do so; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the Chinese Communist Party may use the United States citizens' user information for intelligence gathering, 24 25 intellectual property theft, and other illicit purposes; and 26 27 WHEREAS, TikTok has developed a powerful algorithm which personalizes the videos shown to users based on their 28 29 interactions with content, creating a feed that is addictive to the point of being dubbed 'digital fentanyl'; and 30

1 2 WHEREAS, because the vast majority of TikTok users are young adults between eighteen and thirty-four years old, the 3 privacy of an emerging generation is under threat; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, bipartisan legislation has been introduced in the 7 United States Congress to ban TikTok from operating in the United States; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, the Protecting Americans from Foreign Adversary 11 Controlled Applications Act, H.R.7521, would force ByteDance to 12 divest ownership of the app or be subject to a nationwide ban; 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Energy and Commerce Congressional Committee recently issued a unanimous 50-0 vote to approve H.R.7521 and 16 bring it to the House floor for a vote; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 20 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 21 Session of 2024, that the United States Congress is urged to 22 pass H.R.7521 to protect the nation's cybersecurity; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the President Pro Tempore of the 25 26 United States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and each member of Hawaii's congressional 27 28 delegation. 29 30 Ander 31 OFFERED BY:
