FRANCISCO is a testament to the 4 5 notion that insurmountable challenges faced by immigrants in Hawai'i can be overcome with a strong work ethic and dedication 6 to one's passions and profession; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, CHRISTOPHER PIKE was recently named the Hawai'i District Hilo-Waiākea Complex Area 2024 Teacher of the Year; and 10 11 WHEREAS, CHRISTOPHER PIKE has demonstrated a deep passion 12 for teaching and learning while inspiring the students of 13 Chiefess Kapi'olani Elementary School to strive for excellence; 14 and 15 16 WHEREAS, CHRISTOPHER PIKE began his ten-year educational 17 career at Honaunau Elementary School before becoming a fifth 18 grade teacher and the advisor for the Robotics Club at Chiefess 19 20 Kapi'olani Elementary School; he is passionate about providing culturally relevant education and elevating the voices of 21 students; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, CHRISTOPHER PIKE received his Bachelor of Science 25 in business administration and international relations from SUNY Geneseo and his master's degree in elementary education from 26 Johns Hopkins University; and 27 28 WHEREAS, CHRISTOPHER PIKE has been recognized for his 29 dedication to his profession with multiple educational 30 accolades, such as the 2021 National Educator Award for 31 32 Outstanding Environmental Stewardship from the National Park Trust and a 2022 finalist for the Presidential Award for 33 34 Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching; and 35 WHEREAS, CHRISTOPHER PIKE credits his personal and 36 37 professional success to his colleagues and family who inspire his mission to continue uplifting students through learning with 38 adventure; he specifically acknowledges his mother, also an 39
