9	WHEREAS, a senior at Konawaena High School who embodies the
10 11	aloha spirit, LEHUA NORRIS served as the treasurer on the student council and excelled in other leadership roles on the
12	school's class council, including vice president, treasurer,
13	historian, and secretary; she also represented over 170,000
14	Hawai'i public school students on the executive board of the
15	Hawai'i State Student Council; and

17	WHEREAS, passionate about her culture and community, LEHUA
18 19	NORRIS is an officer on the Pacific and Asian Affairs Council
20	and is involved in various service clubs and academic teams; she has organized local community outreach events focusing on
21	climate change, spreading kindness in Kailua-Kona, and
22	encouraging civic engagement among Hawai'i's youth; and

24	WHEREAS, LEHUA NORRIS seeks to positively impact her
25	community through advocacy and political engagement; her ongoing
26	efforts and academic achievements are a testament to her
27	outstanding leadership skills and dedication to serving her

1 WHEREAS, KYLEE HAMAMOTO was recently named a 2023 Prudential Emerging Visionaries winner; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, Prudential Emerging Visionaries recognizes 25 extraordinary young people throughout the country who are 5 leading innovative projects to address financial and societal 6 challenges in their communities; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, KYLEE HAMAMOTO is a senior at Punahou School and a celebrated visionary leader; she is the founder and President of 10 WeGo! Hawai'i, a non-profit organization aimed at empowering 11 12 strong and independent female leaders; and 13 14 WHEREAS, KYLEE HAMAMOTO's groundbreaking WeGo! Hawai'i Leadership Program has touched the lives of over 200 young women 15 and follows a 4-step curriculum that provides participants with 16 the necessary tools to discover their passions, boosts their 17 self-confidence, supports project creation that positively 18 impacts their communities, and encourages mentorship and 19 networking; the program's innovative leadership model not only 20 21 cultivates a new generation of female leaders, but also emphasizes the value of mentorship, which promotes a self-22 23 sustaining cycle of empowerment; and 24 25 WHEREAS, KYLEE HAMAMOTO developed the WeGo! Hawai'i Leadership Program to inspire women and leaders within her 26 27 community and internationally; chapters have been established in California and Japan, creating a global network of empowered 28 women that has sparked 50 projects rooted in the values of 29 30 aloha, kuleana, laulima, and malama; and 31 WHEREAS, among 25 nationally recognized young students, 32 KYLEE HAMAMOTO is the sole 2023 Prudential Emerging Visionaries 33 winner from Hawai'i; and 34 35 36 WHEREAS, VAEANUI PECK was recently named a 2023 U.S. 37 Presidential Scholar; and 38 WHEREAS, the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program, 39 40 established in 1964 by executive order of the President,

1 recognizes and honors some of the nation's most distinguished 2 graduating high school seniors; VAEANUI PECK was selected as a 3 U.S. Presidential Scholar in Career and Technical Education 4 (CTE), a category that only honors up to 20 students nationwide; 5 and

7 WHEREAS, an exceptional student and dedicated learner, 8 VAEANUI PECK ranked first in her class at Kahuku High and 9 Intermediate School with a remarkable GPA of 4.145 and graduated 10 as a valedictorian with STEM Capstone, National Honor Society, 11 and CTE honors; and

13 WHEREAS, displaying enthusiasm for higher education early 14 on, VAEANUI PECK participated in the Windward Community College 15 Early College Program, earning 26 college credits towards an 16 associate degree; she currently studies mechanical engineering 17 and renewable energy at Yale University, where she is involved 18 in the Indigenous Peoples of Oceania Student Club and Bulldogs 19 Racing, an engineering club that builds electric racecars; and 20

21 WHEREAS, committed to sustainability and passionate about 22 innovation, VAEANUI PECK interned as an agricultural engineer at 23 Kualoa Ranch, where she developed a vertical saltwater 24 hydroponic system for sea asparagus; this experience inspired 25 the deployment and utilization of hydroponic systems for Kahuku 26 High and Intermediate School's Agriculture Program; and

28 WHEREAS, displaying exceptional talent outside the 29 classroom, VAEANUI PECK was a member of her school's CTE club 30 and hydroponics program and participated in track and field and 31 cross country; her involvement in many extracurricular 32 activities demonstrates her leadership skills and commitment to 33 personal growth; and

WHEREAS, the 2024 Hawai'i LifeSmarts State Competition tests students on their knowledge of personal finance, consumer rights and responsibilities, health and safety, technology, and the environment, and is an excellent opportunity for students to learn and develop academically and personally; the competition is run by the National Consumers League and sponsored in Hawai'i by the Business Registration and Insurance Divisions of the
