HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR AND PERTINENT STATE AGENCIES TO COMMIT TO PROVIDE CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE RESOURCES, SERVICES, AND PROGRAMS FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES EXPERIENCING INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

WHEREAS, the State has committed to improving the quality 1 of life of individuals with intellectual and developmental 2 disabilities, necessitating the provision of relief to families 3 and care providers; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the State continues to identify the needs of individuals, families, and care providers with intellectual and 7 developmental disabilities, evidencing the ongoing need for 8 continued support; and 9 10 WHEREAS, intellectual and developmental disabilities are 11 often lifelong disabilities that may involve challenges that 12 affect intellectual functioning and adaptive functioning, or a 13 person's ability to learn, reason, communicate, socialize, or 14 15 perform self-care tasks; and 16 WHEREAS, developmental disabilities, which include 17 intellectual disabilities, are a broad group of conditions that 18 may involve an impairment in physical, learning, cognitive, 19 20 language and communication, or behavior areas; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the term "intellectual and developmental disabilities" was established and is continuously used to be 23 encompassing and far-reaching in its inclusivity, expressing the 24 25 community's diversity and recognizing individuals' unique strengths, challenges, needs, and experiences; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the true extent of the cognitive abilities of 28 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities is 29 30 not accurately reflected by measures of intelligence, as there

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1 are seemingly infinite ways that individuals learn or express themselves; and 2 3 WHEREAS, individuals with intellectual and developmental 4 disabilities are unique in their own right and the notion of a 5 one-size-fits-all approach is insufficient to fully appreciate 6 and provide appropriate support for their inherent uniqueness; 7 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, this body acknowledges the intrinsic individuality of those with intellectual and developmental disabilities and 11 understands the importance of developing and providing 12 13 culturally appropriate services, programs, and resources that not only uphold their dignity and active inclusion as valued 14 members of the community, but also nurture their potential and 15 safeguard their well-being; and 16 17 WHEREAS, individuals with intellectual and developmental 18 19 disabilities have an inherent right to immerse themselves in 20 their cultural identities, necessitating the provision of culturally appropriate and culturally sensitive services, 21 programs, and resources as essential to the adequacy of support 22 and inclusivity; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, their families, and their care providers require 26 27 equitable resources and support, commensurate with their socioeconomic standing, to endure in their everyday lives; and 28 29 WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon society to protect and 30 provide for the most vulnerable communities in ensuring that all 31 people have equitable opportunities and access to thrive; and 32 33 34 WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians are overrepresented among individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, 35 while also facing disproportionate underdiagnosis, indicating 36 systemic disparities and increased vulnerabilities; and 37 38 WHEREAS, traditional Native Hawaiian family-based and 39 communal structures established systems of effective care for 40 individuals of all ages, including the most vulnerable members 41 42 of society; and

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2 WHEREAS, these traditional family-based and communal
3 structures were dismantled and are furthered by unresolved
4 historical injustice; now, therefore,

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 8 Session of 2024, that the Governor and other pertinent state 9 agencies are urged to commit to providing culturally appropriate 10 resources, services, and programs for Native Hawaiian 11 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and 12 their families; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health,
Superintendent of Education, Director of Human Services,
President of the University of Hawaii System, Chairperson of the
Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, and
Chairperson of the State Council on Developmental Disabilities.
