HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO DEVELOP A STRATEGIC PLAN TO STRENGTHEN FOOD SECURITY FOR LOW-INCOME COMMUNITIES IN HAWAII.

1	WHEREAS, food security is a fundamental human right and a
2	critical component of public health and well-being; and
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4	WHEREAS, Hawaii's Aloha+ Challenge established a goal of
5	increasing access to labor and land resources to support
6	production, processing, distribution, and consumption of local
7	food by 2030, with an overall target of twenty to thirty percent
8	of food consumed in Hawaii being grown locally; and
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10	WHEREAS, the State's Sustainable Hawaii Initiative set
11	forth a target of doubling local food production by 2020; and
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13	WHEREAS, low-income communities in Hawaii face significant
14	challenges in accessing nutritious and affordable food, leading
15	to food insecurity and related health disparities; and
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17	WHEREAS, promoting local food production and enhancing food
18	security in underserved areas can contribute to better health
19	and well-being, economic security, and environmental
20	sustainability; and
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22	WHEREAS, developing a strategic plan to increase food
23	security and food production in low-income communities requires
24	a comprehensive approach that addresses issues related to food
25	access, affordability, land use, agricultural production,
26	education and vocational training programs, and community
27	engagement; and
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29	WHEREAS, strategic planning efforts should involve
30	collaboration among government agencies, community
31	organizations, agricultural stakeholders, and other relevant
32	entities to effectively leverage resources and expertise; and

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1 WHEREAS, implementing targeted strategies tailored to the 2 3 unique needs and priorities of different communities can maximize the impact of food security initiatives and ensure 4 equitable access to nutritious food for all residents; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, investing in programs and initiatives that support 8 local food production, such as community gardens, urban farms, 9 farmers' markets, and agricultural education programs, can 10 strengthen food systems and reduce dependence on imported food; 11 now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 15 Session of 2024, that the Department of Agriculture is requested 16 to develop a strategic plan to strengthen food security for low-17 income communities in Hawaii; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the strategic plan is requested 20 to: 21 22 (1)Assess the current status of food security and food 23 production in low-income communities; 24 25 (2) Identify barriers and challenges to accessing locally 26 produced and nutritious food in underserved areas; 27 28 (3) Develop strategies to expand access to affordable and locally sourced food options; 29 30 31 (4) Consider opportunities for increasing support of local 32 farmers through economic incentives, technical 33 assistance, capacity building programs, and other 34 public investments; 35 36 (5) Evaluate the utility of community-based initiatives in 37 addressing food insecurity for low-income areas, 38 including community gardens, urban farms, agricultural 39 education endeavors, and farmers' markets; 40

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1 (6) Analyze ways of expanding access to agricultural 2 education and vocational training programs related to 3 local food production in low-income communities; 4 5 (7) Assess the effectiveness of food security interventions, measurements, and adjustment strategies 6 with regard to stakeholder feedback and preferred 7 8 outcomes; and 9 10 (8) Determine the resources and funding that may be 11 necessary to implement a strategic plan to enhance 12 food security for low-income communities; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture is requested to submit its strategic plan, including any 15 proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty 16 17 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Lieutenant Governor; Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture; Director of Human 21 22 Services; Director of Business, Economic Development, and 23 Tourism; and Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development 24 Corporation. 25 26 27 OFFERED BY:
