HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO INFORM THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE OPTIONS AVAILABLE TO ADDRESS THE STATE'S FERAL CHICKEN POPULATION.

WHEREAS, many residents in Hawaii are concerned about feral 1 chickens that create nuisances by foraging in residential areas, 2 crowing at inconvenient hours, posing health concerns due to 3 their waste, posing a potential threat to native birds, and 4 agitating household pets; and 5 6 WHEREAS, to effectively deal with feral chickens it is 7 critical that the State work together with the counties and the 8 affected communities to identify collaborative solutions to 9 control the significant increase in the feral chicken 10 11 population; and 12 WHEREAS, the Department of Customer Services of the City 13 and County of Honolulu has expanded their feral chicken removal 14 service to include private property owners, who can rent cages 15 16 at a nominal cost; and 17 WHEREAS, there are a wide variety of homespun measures that 18 19 can be taken by individual property owners to deter feral chickens from entering their property, such as creating 20 barriers, using a motion sensor sprinkler or mechanical decoy, 21 and even spraying the ground with citrus or pungent herbs; and 22 23 WHEREAS, OvoControl has been around for years but is used 24 sparingly, is approved and registered by the Environmental 25 Protection Agency, and has been used very effectively for the 26 control of feral pigeons in Waikiki and elsewhere; and 27 28 WHEREAS, the most effective way to control the population 29 of feral chickens would be through a contraceptive injection 30



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administered by a veterinarian; however, this method is costly 1 2 at \$150 per injection; and 3 WHEREAS, there are a significant number of residents who 4 oppose the eradication of feral chickens, and who cite positive 5 benefits like the chickens' ability to keep centipedes at bay, 6 note that chickens do not pose a threat to native birds, and 7 that more efficient, eco-conscious methods can be used to manage 8 9 the population; and 10 WHEREAS, the responsibility for responding to feral 11 12 chickens will vary based on the location of the birds and the 13 property ownership; and 14 WHEREAS, there appears to be a variety of solutions that 15 can be adopted depending on needs and available resources; and 16 17 WHEREAS, it is important that residents are made aware of 18 the variety of solutions available in order to make informed 19 decisions on how to best address their particular challenge with 20 21 feral chickens; now, therefore, 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2024, that the Department of Land and Natural 25 Resources is requested to convene a working group to inform the 26 public about the options available to address the State's feral 27 chicken population; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 30 to consist of the following members: 31 32 The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 33 (1)Resources, or the Chairperson's designee, who shall 34 serve as chairperson of the working group; 35 36 (2) The Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, or the 37 Chairperson's designee; 38 39 (3) The Director of Health, or the Director's designee; 40 41
