## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS TO REPORT ON STRATEGIES FOR NATIVE HAWAIIAN RURAL RESILIENCY.

WHEREAS, safeguarding the character and identity of 1 Hawaii's rural and remote communities is fundamental to the 2 character, identity, and future of the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rural and remote communities are under 5 6 threat of erasure due to the ongoing challenges of rapid urbanization, gentrification, economic instability, limited 7 resources, and limited access to essential services; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rural and remote communities are historically disadvantaged, facing greater disparities in health 11 care, education, food security, and economic opportunities in 12 13 the State; and 14 WHEREAS, despite these disproportionate challenges, 15 Hawaii's rural and remote communities are resilient, highly 16 adaptive, and tempered, with aspirations to address their 17 18 problems while preserving their character and identity; and 19 WHEREAS, historical barriers to addressing the disparities 20 endured by Hawaii's rural and remote communities may be overcome 21 through the use of technological advancements, providing 22 innovative solutions in community-led economic development; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, the lack of economic opportunities in Hawaii's rural and remote communities forces trans-generational 26 outmigration of residents, exacerbating vulnerabilities and 27 accelerating the erasure of community character and identity; 28 29 and 30 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rural and remote communities comprise 31 some of the last remaining bastions of intact and ecologically 32 interconnected native Hawaiian culture, serving as treasured and 33

1 living archives of wisdom for the benefit of present and future generations; and 2 3 WHEREAS, protecting the rural character and identity of 4 5 these communities is essential for the State to uphold its obligations to the Native Hawaiian people; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, Hawaii's catastrophic loss of biodiversity, significantly attributed to urbanization, has led to its 9 10 recognition as the "endangered species capital of the world"; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rural and remote communities are critical 14 buffer areas between urban sprawl, serving as vital green 15 infrastructure and corridors for the conservation and bolstering of natural environmental systems and resources; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the green infrastructure provided by Hawaii's 18 19 rural and remote communities is essential for Hawaii's 20 resiliency in the face of existential threats like climate 21 change; and 22 23 WHEREAS, climate change will have a more severe impact on historically disadvantaged communities, which face 24 25 disproportionate social vulnerabilities without adequate 26 strategies and support; and 27 28 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rural and remote communities are integral to the State's resilience against supply chain vulnerabilities, 29 food insecurity, and crises, upholding critical infrastructure 30 sectors, including food and agriculture; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, adequate solutions to the plight of Hawaii's rural 34 and remote communities should be achieved through the responsible and appropriate intersection and participation of 35 36 external and internal entities that seek to preserve each community's character and identity; and 37 38 39 WHEREAS, Hawaii's rural and remote communities have the capacity to propose solutions to their challenges, provided 40 41 their voices are amplified and heard and they receive the necessary resources and support, without disrupting the 42
