## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A MAKUA VALLEY TASK FORCE TO PREPARE FOR THE TRANSITION OF THE MANAGEMENT OF THE MAKUA MILITARY RESERVATION FROM THE UNITED STATES ARMY TO THE STATE.

WHEREAS, Makua Valley on Oahu was seized by the United 1 States military for training following the attack on Pearl 2 Harbor on December 7, 1941; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaiian, Japanese, and Portuguese families living in Makua Valley were evicted from their lands, with the promise 6 that the displacement would be temporary and their lands would 7 be cleaned up and returned; and 8 9 WHEREAS, instead, Makua Valley remained under the 10 management of the United States Army and continued to be the 11 site of decades of live-fire military training; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Makua Military Reservation spans nearly five 14 15 thousand acres and is home to over forty endangered and threatened species and dozens of sacred and cultural sites; and 16 17 WHEREAS, in December 2023, the United States Department of 18 Defense confirmed that it would permanently end live-fire 19 20 training in Makua Valley; and 21 22 WHEREAS, under the terms of a 2001 settlement, the military has not conducted live-fire training at Makua Valley since 2004; 23 however, the court filing removed the threat that Makua would 24 ever again be subjected to live-fire training; and 25 26 WHEREAS, management of the Makua Military Reservation will 27 28 transfer from the United States Army to the State when General 29 Lease No. S-3848 expires in 2029; and 30



WHEREAS, the creation of a task force would facilitate 1 conversations necessary to prepare for the transition of the 2 3 management of the Makua Military Reservation from the United States Army to the State; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 6 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 7 Session of 2024, that the Department of Land and Natural 8 Resources is requested to convene a Makua Valley Task Force to 9 prepare for the transition of the management of the Makua 10 Military Reservation from the United States Army to the State; 11 12 and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Makua Valley Task Force is requested to consist of the following members: 15 16 (1)The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 17 Resources, or the Chairperson's designee; 18 19 A member of the Board of Trustees of the Office of 20 (2) Hawaiian Affairs, or the member's designee; 21 22 A member of the House of Representatives, to be 23 (3) 24 selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 25 26 27 (4) A member of the Senate, to be selected by the President of the Senate; and 28 29 (5) A member of the Aha Moku Advisory Committee; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 33 invite representatives of the following organizations to serve on the task force: 34 35 (1)One representative of families who were evicted from 36 37 Makua Valley or whose lands in Makua Valley were condemned by the federal government; 38 39 Three representatives, each representing a different 40 (2) non-profit organization, with expertise on Makua 41 42 Valley; and



1 2 (3) A representative selected from a list provided by 3 native Hawaiian organizations; and 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 5 6 invite the Commanding General of the United States Army Pacific, or the Commanding General's designee, to serve as a military 7 representative on the task force; and 8 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to elect a chairperson from among themselves; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in preparing for the transition 13 of the management of the Makua Military Reservation from the 14 United States Army, the task force is requested to enter into 15 discussions with the United States Army to: 16 17 (1)Facilitate the expedient return of the Makua Military 18 19 Reservation upon the expiration of the United States Army's lease; 20 21 22 (2) Ensure the clean-up of unexploded ordnance; and 23 Ensure the expansion of opportunities for cultural 24 (3) 25 access; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to base its plans and policies for transition on the goal of 28 transferring the lands currently held by the United States Army 29 30 under General Lease No. S-3848 to the State, which shall: 31 32 (1) Hold the lands in trust as part of the public land 33 trust; and 34 35 (2) Transfer management and control of the lands to the sovereign native Hawaiian entity upon its recognition 36 37 by the United States and the State; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the task force shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 40 41 reasonable expenses necessary for the performance of their 42 duties, including travel expenses; and



1 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 3 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 4 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 5 2025; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall cease to exist six months after the August 16, 2029, expiration of the 9 United States Army's lease for the Makua Military Reservation 10 under General Lease No. S-3848; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Resolution be transmitted to the Commanding Officer of the 14 United States Army Pacific, Chairperson of the Board of Land and 15 Natural Resources, and Executive Director of the Aha Moku 16 17 Advisory Committee. 18 19 OFFERED BY: Ce 40 20
