HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO EXEMPT HAWAII FROM THE JONES ACT.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii is the most isolated populated land mass on earth and is located more than 2,400 miles from the United 2 3 States mainland; and 4 WHEREAS, the State imports approximately eighty percent of 5 its goods, ninety percent of its food, and ninety-five percent 6 of its energy resources; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, unlike other states, Hawaii is unable to import goods, food, or fuel via trucks or trains, making the State 10 uniquely vulnerable to shipping disruptions; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Merchant Marine Act of 1920, commonly known as 13 14 the Jones Act, requires that all goods shipped between United States ports be transported by ships that are United 15 States-flagged and built; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, a shortage of United States-flagged oil tankers makes it difficult for Hawaii to import energy resources from 19 20 the mainland United States; and 21 WHEREAS, exempting Hawaii from the Jones Act would allow 22 the State to reduce its dependence on foreign oil and to import 23 24 more energy resources from California; now, therefore, 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 26 27 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the President of the United States and 28 United States Congress are urged to exempt Hawaii from the Jones 29 Act; and 30 31
