## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO ESTABLISH A SAFE PARKING PILOT PROGRAM THAT ALLOWS HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS LIVING IN THEIR CARS TO PARK ON STATE LANDS DURING PROHIBITED HOURS.

WHEREAS, homelessness is an issue that has been prevalent 1 for decades in the State, especially on Oahu; and 2 3 WHEREAS, a person who is homeless is at higher risk of 4 5 their general welfare, safety, and health being threatened; and 6 WHEREAS, additionally, Native Hawaiians and Pacific 7 8 Islanders face the highest rates of homelessness compared to any other racial group in the State; and 9 10 WHEREAS, shelter is a basic necessity; however, existing 11 state law prohibits using one's vehicle for purposes of human 12 13 habitation while the vehicle is parked on public property between 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.; and 14 15 WHEREAS, homeless shelters are available, yet they are not 16 always viable due to various circumstances or restrictions, such 17 as space, location, safety, shelter rules that may prohibit 18 spouses or pets, limitations based on mental or physical health, 19 20 or curfews; and 21 WHEREAS, many jurisdictions in California have established 22 23 safe parking pilot programs to provide a safe place to park and 24 receive basic services for individuals who are living in their vehicles; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Bellevue, Washington is also planning to open a 27 similar safe parking pilot program in spring 2024 to provide 28 temporary support for homeless individuals who are struggling to 29 find stable housing; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, establishing a safe parking program in the State
can help Hawaii's homeless population find a safe place to park
and rest at night, providing stability to these individuals as
they seek permanent housing; now, therefore,

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 8 Session of 2024, that the Department of Transportation is urged 9 to establish a safe parking pilot program that allows homeless 10 individuals living in their cars to park on state lands during 11 prohibited hours; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Transportation is requested to submit a report on the status of the safe parking pilot program no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of thisResolution be transmitted to the Director of Transportation.
