## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTY OF MAUI TO ADOPT A FINANCIALLY PRUDENT BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026 THAT MAINTAINS CURRENT OPERATIONAL LEVELS EXCEPT FOR CERTAIN MANDATORY OR CRITICAL INCREASES.

WHEREAS, the August 2023 wildfires on the island of Maui 1 destroyed the core of historic Front Street in Lahaina, Maui, 2 and many surrounding neighborhoods, killing over a hundred 3 people, destroying thousands of residential and commercial 4 5 structures, and displacing thousands of residents; and 6 WHEREAS, the August 2023 wildfires also destroyed dozens of 7 8 structures and displaced dozens of families in Upcountry Maui; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, the cost to respond to and recover from this 11 tragedy at the federal, state, and county levels is estimated to 12 13 be in the billions of dollars over multiple years; and 14 15 WHEREAS, in addition to response and recovery costs, the 16 State and County of Maui also stand to lose significant revenue from general excise taxes, transient accommodations taxes, and 17 real property taxes because of a decrease in visitors to the 18 19 island of Maui due to occupancy of hotel rooms by displaced families, loss of property use and value, and waivers to 20 21 incentivize long-term rentals over short-term rentals; and 22 WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2025-2026 budget currently being 23 deliberated on by this body is likely to include hundreds of 24 millions of dollars for the County of Maui for various aspects 25 of recovery; and 26 27 WHEREAS, fiscal restraint will be needed in other areas of 28 29 state operations to offset recovery funds for the County of 30 Maui; and 31





1 WHEREAS, Maui County Mayor Richard T. Bissen, Jr., presented his proposed budget for fiscal year 2025-2026 to the 2 Maui County Council on March 25, 2024; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, according to the Mayor's press release, the proposed budget reflects an increase of \$429,200,000 over the 6 7 prior fiscal year, a 33.9 percent increase, while at the same time expecting \$150,000,000 from the State; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the proposed budget also includes funding needed 10 to support new departments and agencies, specifically a new 11 Department of 'Oiwi Resources, a new water authority to be known 12 as the East Maui Regional Community Board, and a new Department 13 of Housing arising out of the splitting of the existing 14 15 Department of Housing and Human Concerns, which were mandated by amendments made to the Maui County Charter in 2022; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the proposed budget also includes funding needed 19 to implement recommendations from wildfire after-action reports; 20 and 21 22 WHEREAS, the County of Maui additionally faces unknown 23 costs to defend itself in numerous lawsuits relating to the wildfires; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, other than these necessary spending increases and those needed to continue recovery efforts, the fiscal year 2025-27 2026 budget for the County of Maui should be conservative and 28 29 not increase personnel and operating expenses that will continue 30 to be supported in future years; and 31 32 WHEREAS, the County of Maui has experienced staffing shortages for years and has struggled to improve high vacancy 33 34 rates, suggesting that it may be premature to increase the County's budget for additional positions when current vacancies 35 cannot be filled; and 36 37 38 WHEREAS, the Maui County Council begins its deliberations 39 on the fiscal year 2025-2026 budget on April 1, 2024, and has scheduled a second and final reading for the budget ordinances 40 for June 5, 2024; now, therefore, 41 42



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, that the County of Maui is urged to adopt a financially prudent budget for fiscal year 2025-2026; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Maui County Council is 7 urged to adopt, and Mayor Bissen is urged to sign, a fiscal year 8 2025-2026 budget that maintains current operational levels, such 9 as staffing, except for increases mandated by the Maui County 10 Charter or those critical to wildfire response; and

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Mayor of the County 14 of Maui, and members of the Maui County Council.
