## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that homelessness
2	continues to be one of Hawaii's most dire and persistent
3	challenges. Native Hawaiians are disproportionately affected by
4	the housing crisis. Although Native Hawaiians represent less
5	than twenty per cent of the State's population, according to the
6	2020 point-in-time count, Native Hawaiians represent over half
7	of all homeless individuals.
8	The legislature further finds that the department of
9	Hawaiian home lands owns lots that are available for development
10	along the Leeward coast of Oahu that might be suitable for a
11	pilot program that focuses on providing supportive housing to
12	certain native Hawaiian beneficiaries.
13	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
14	(1) Establish under the department of Hawaiian home lands
15	a native Hawaiian supportive housing pilot program on
16	the Leeward coast of Oahu to provide housing and

services to native Hawaiian beneficiaries, who are

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1		homeless, or threatened with homelessness, and on the
2		department of Hawaiian home lands waiting list; and
3	(2)	Appropriate funds to support the establishment of a
4		native Hawaiian supportive housing pilot program on
5		the Leeward coast of Oahu.
6	SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established the native Hawaiian
7	supportiv	e housing pilot program on the Leeward coast of Oahu
8	under the	department of Hawaiian home lands to provide
9	individua	l or shared micro housing units and services to native
10	Hawaiian 1	beneficiaries who are homeless, or threatened with
11	homelessn	ess, and on the department of Hawaiian home lands
12	waiting l	ist. The department may determine other eligibility
13	requireme	nts as necessary to carry out the purposes of this Act.
14	(b)	The department may purchase lands and shall retain the
15	authority	to determine which lands to use for the native
16	Hawaiian	supportive housing pilot program.
17	(c)	The department shall create and make available
18	financial	education programs to assist participants of the pilot
19	program to	o be financially prepared for a transition to long-term
20	housing s	olutions.

1	(d) The department may cooperate with any state
2	departments or agencies and private nonprofit organizations as
3	needed to expedite the development and operation of housing
4	under the native Hawaiian supportive housing pilot program,
5	including agencies with specific expertise in construction
6	development and agencies with specific expertise in
7	administering homeless services. The department may
8	construct individual or shared micro housing units,
9	that shall be situated on the Leeward coast of Oahu.
10	(e) The department may coordinate with public or private
11	entities, as appropriate, to develop and implement the native
12	Hawaiian supportive housing pilot program; provided that:
13	(1) The department may work with the appropriate
14	construction agency to ensure that the individual or
15	shared micro housing units' infrastructure needs are
16	met and minimize adverse impacts to the environment,
17	including nearshore resources such as corals, reef
18	fish, and seabirds;
19	(2) Use of the individual or shared micro housing units
20	may be used for affordable housing as may be
21	determined by the department; and

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1	(3)	The	communities may allow for off-the-grid			
2		technologies that can provide drinking water,				
3		electricity, and process sewage without existing				
4		infr	astructure.			
5	(f)	The native Hawaiian supportive housing pilot program				
6	may provi	de the following facilities and services:				
7	(1)	Secure dwelling spaces that:				
8		(A)	May be private or communal;			
9		(B)	Are designed aesthetically and constructed of			
10			quality materials;			
11		(C)	Have access to toilets, showers, and other			
12			hygiene facilities;			
13		(D)	Have access to adequate facilities that allow for			
14			cooking and meal preparation; and			
15		(E)	Have common spaces that build community and			
16			encourage sustainability;			
17	(2)	Medi	cal and social support services; and			
18	(3)	Tran	sportation to appointments related to medical care			
19		or s	upportive services that are not available onsite.			
20	(g)	The	department may consult with the department of			
21	human ser	vices	and department of health to administer the native

- 2 section.
- 3 (h) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to be
- 4 inconsistent with, or contrary to, any act of the Hawaiian Homes
- 5 Commission Act 1920, as amended, or any regulation adopted or
- 6 standard established pursuant to that Act.
- 7 (i) The native Hawaiian supportive housing pilot program
- 8 shall not be implemented with funds appropriated pursuant to Act
- 9 279, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, or funds from any subsequent
- 10 Act appropriating funds for the purposes of Act 279, Session
- 11 Laws of Hawaii 2022.
- 12 (i) As used in this section:
- "Department" means the department of Hawaiian home lands.
- 14 "Leeward coast" means lands on the island of Oahu west of
- 15 Kapolei.
- "Threatened with homelessness" means lacking the resources
- 17 to maintain the mortgage, utility, taxes, or other expenses
- 18 associated with maintaining a residence.
- 19 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and

- 1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 2 year 2024-2025 to establish and administer the native Hawaiian
- 3 supportive housing pilot program on the Leeward coast of Oahu.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of Hawaiian home lands for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
