A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HONOLUA BAY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the purchase of Lipoa point, which is the home of the iconic Honolua bay, was a milestone in the State's preservation of important natural areas. Not only are Lipoa point and Honolua bay home to numerous native species of marine biota, they also have special cultural significance and are one of the last few undeveloped places for the sport of surfing.

8 The legislature further finds that despite this monumental 9 acquisition, the department of land and natural resources has 10 squandered this historic investment by failing to allocate 11 sufficient funds for much needed remediation of erosion and 12 other types of necessary care for the area, including illegal 13 dumping, over-tourism, crime, soil erosion, and the 14 proliferation of invasive noxious plants. Furthermore, these 15 harms also threaten the health of the coral reef growth of the 16 marine life conservation district located in the adjoining area 17 of Honolua bay.

1 The legislature further finds that numerous visitor 2 recreation entities and visitors frequent Honolua bay and that 3 visitor fees could provide a meaningful source of revenue to 4 heal and protect Honolua bay and preserve it for the future use 5 of all. New visitor management initiatives used in other areas 6 such as Iao park and Waianapanapa park could be extended to Honolua bay to manage and fund support for the area. However, 7 8 fees and associated voluntary donation programs are popular with 9 visitors if, and only if, the funds remain solely dedicated to 10 preserving and protecting the area for which the fees and 11 donations are being collected.

12 The legislature further finds that public funds were 13 appropriated for the development of a strategic plan that did 14 not include the meaningful participation of many community 15 members and other groups. Therefore, a need exists to fund and 16 create extended meaningful participation and a long-term 17 strategic plan for the management and restoration of Lipoa point and Honolua bay. The legislature finds that a permanent 18 19 citizens advisory council made up of these various community 20 members and groups is needed to oversee a special fund and the

(a) There is established in the state treasury the Honolua bay special fund 4 5 into which shall be deposited the following moneys: 6 (1)Appropriations by the legislature to the special fund; 7 (2) Appropriations by the Maui county council to the 8 special fund; Grants from the federal government; and 9 (3) 10 (4) Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies and 11 private persons. 12 (b) All interest earned on the moneys in the special fund shall be credited to the special fund. 13 14 (C) Moneys in the Honolua bay special fund shall be 15 expended for conservation purposes, upkeep and maintenance of 16 Lipoa point, and any other use consistent with the purposes of 17 this Act. Moneys shall also be expended for the creation of an 18 ingress and egress loop to provide for surf access to the bay. 19 (d) The Honolua bay special fund shall be exempt from the 20 department administrative expenses of section 36-30, Hawaii 21 Revised Statutes.

1 shall be responsible for its pro rata share of the 2 administrative expenses incurred by the department responsible 3 for the operations supported by the special fund concerned." 4 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 5 or so 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 8 year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the Honolua bay special 9 fund.

10 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the Honolua bay 11 special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be 12 necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the 14 purposes of this Act.

15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 16 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act. 17 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 19

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
