# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the research 2 corporation of the university of Hawaii, a public 3 instrumentality of the State that is administratively attached to the university of Hawaii, was established in 1965 for the 4 5 purposes of promoting, encouraging, initiating, developing, and 6 conducting scientific research and investigation in all branches 7 of learning and disseminating this research and investigation to 8 the public. 9 To promote cooperative research projects with private firms 10 and persons, the legislature at the time granted the research 11 corporation of the university of Hawaii flexibility in the 12 hiring of its personnel and handling and disbursement of moneys 13 by exempting the corporation from state laws relating to 14 reimbursement of special funds to the state general fund; 15 advertisement for bids and purchases to be made in Hawaii 16 whenever public moneys are expended; civil service;

17 compensation; and public employment. The legislature finds,

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1 however, that it is a matter of statewide concern that the 2 research corporation of the university of Hawaii has gradually 3 expanded its undertakings over the years into areas beyond its original eponymous purpose, and the benefits of the exemptions 4 from statutory requirements have been extended to apply beyond 5 6 what was originally intended by the legislature. For example, the research corporation's website currently states that one of 7 its missions is to "support and enhance . . . development" in 8 9 Hawaii.

10 The purpose of this Act is to clarify that the purpose of 11 the research corporation of the university of Hawaii is to 12 promote educational, scientific, and literary pursuits through 13 research, training of research personnel, and dissemination of 14 knowledge by publication of research findings, and the 15 corporation's undertakings shall be limited to acts that are 16 reasonably necessary to carry out this purpose.

17 SECTION 2. Section 304A-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is18 amended to read as follows:

19 "[f]\$304A-112[f] Contracts for services provided by the 20 research corporation of the [University] university of Hawaii. 21 (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, when the





1 university determines that neither the university nor another 2 state agency can more effectively or efficiently accomplish the 3 purposes of the sponsored research and training activities, the 4 university [shall] may contract with the research corporation of the [University] university of Hawaii established under section 5 6 [+]304A-3001[+] to provide management and other services as 7 described in subsection (b) to support the university's research 8 and training activities. Contracts by the university with the 9 research corporation pursuant to this section shall be limited 10 to sponsored research and training projects; except that 11 [university projects-supported-by] funds appropriated by the 12 legislature may [also] be [contracted] expended to contract with 13 the research corporation [pursuant to rules adopted-by-the board 14 of regents.] for purposes of supporting or facilitating 15 sponsored research and training activities or for promoting and 16 developing the scientific and commercial value of inventions, 17 discoveries, and processes. 18 (b) Management and other support services provided by the

19 research corporation pursuant to this section may include:

- 20 (1) The procurement of goods and services;
- 21 (2) Employment of personnel; and



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1	(3) The provision of advance funding for research and
2	training contracts and grants.
3	These services may be provided by the corporation to the
4	university without regard to [ <del>chapter</del> ] <u>chapters</u> 76, 78, 89, [ <del>or</del> ]
5	<u>and</u> 103D.
6	(c) For each state project or program involving the
7	research corporation, the university shall notify the exclusive
8	representative of the appropriate bargaining unit to review
9	conformance of positions that are planned to be hired through
10	the research corporation with exceptions to collective
11	bargaining. The corporation shall not supplant civil service
12	employees, and if any programs actively employ civil service
13	employees, the corporation shall provide justification for each
14	civil service employee that will be supplanted with a list of
15	the program affected in its next report to the legislature."
16	SECTION 3. Section 304A-3001, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
18	"(b) The purposes of the research corporation shall
19	[include, but not be limited to,] be the promotion of [all]
20	educational, scientific, and literary pursuits [by:] through:

18		fellowships, scholarships, publications, and lectures;
19	[ <del>(5)</del>	Engaging in other means of making the benefits of
20		training, investigations, research, and study
21		available to the public; and

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1	<del>(6)</del>	Taking any and all other actions reasonably designed
2		to promote these purposes in the interest of promoting
3		the general welfare of the people of the State.]
4	(4)	Promoting and developing the scientific and commercial
5		value of inventions, discoveries, and processes; and
6	(5)	Disseminating knowledge through the publication of
7		research findings."
8	SECT	ION 4. Section 304A-3003, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to	o read as follows:
10	"[ <del>[</del> ]:	§304A-3003[]] Powers of the research corporation. (a)
11	The resea:	rch corporation, under the direction of the board of
12	directors	, shall have the following general powers:
13	(1)	To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the
14		conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers
15		and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon
16		it by law;
17	(2)	To sell, lease, rent, hold, maintain, use, and operate
18		any property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or
19		intangible, in accordance with the conditions under
20		which it was received;

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1 (3) To enter into and perform [such] contracts, leases, 2 cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the 3 university or any other agency or political subdivision of the State, any private person, firm, 4 5 partnership, association, company, or corporation, only [as it may be] when the board of directors 6 7 determines that doing so is necessary in the conduct 8 of [its] the research corporation's business as 9 described in section 304A-3001 and only on [such] 10 terms [as it may deem] that the board of directors 11 deems reasonable and appropriate; provided that the 12 research corporation shall not obligate any funds of 13 the State except those that have been appropriated to 14 it.

15 Notwithstanding the foregoing, the research 16 corporation may enter into and perform [such] 17 contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other 18 transactions with any agency or instrumentality of the 19 United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, 20 or a possession, or with any political subdivision 21 thereof, for research, training of research personnel,





1 or publication of research findings, whenever the donating or granting agency or instrumentality 2 3 determines and documents that the university or any 4 other agency of the State cannot [as effectively and efficiently] accomplish the purposes for which [such] 5 6 the contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or 7 other transactions are being entered into; provided 8 that the research corporation shall not obligate any 9 funds of the State except those that have been 10 appropriated to it;

11 (4) To receive by gifts, grants, devises, bequests, or 12 otherwise from private sources only, any property, 13 real, personal, or mixed, intangible or tangible, 14 absolutely or in trust, to be used and disposed of, 15 either the principal or the income therefrom, in accordance with the conditions under which it was 16 17 received; [except] provided that no gift to the 18 research corporation shall be accepted unless approved 19 [or - confirmed] by the board of directors [-,] as a gift 20 that is beneficial to the research corporation's 21 business as described in section 304A-3001.





1		Notwithstanding the foregoing, the research
2		corporation may receive gifts, grants, [or awards from
3		any agency or instrumentality of the United States, a
4		foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a possession,
5		or from any political subdivision thereof, ] devises,
6		or bequests on behalf of the university or any other
7		agency of the State, whenever the [ <del>donating</del> ] <u>donor</u> or
8		[granting-agency-or-instrumentality] grantor
9		determines and documents that the university or any
10		other agency of the State cannot [as effectively and
11		efficiently] accomplish the purposes for which the
12		gifts, grants, [ <del>or awards are being</del> ] <u>devises, or</u>
13		<pre>bequests are made[, except]; provided that no gift to</pre>
14		the research corporation shall be accepted unless
15		approved [or confirmed] by the board of directors[ $\div$ ]
16		as a gift that is beneficial to the research
17		corporation's business as described in section 304A-
18		<u>3001;</u>
19	(5)	To have a corporate seal;

13		its employees, or a contractor of the research
14		corporation. The [ <del>printing or</del> ] preparation and
15		publication of research findings may be accomplished
16		through whatever person, company, or agency is deemed
17		most appropriate by the board of directors; [and]
18	(15)	To retain contracts related to invasive species
19		control and eradication; and
20	[ <del>(14)</del> ]	(16) To do any or all other acts reasonably necessary
21		to carry out the [ <del>objects and</del> ] purposes of the

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1	research corporation [and the university.] described
2	in section 304A-3001.
3	(b) As used in this section, "research personnel" means
4	any individual who is classified by the university or the hiring
5	entity as a research worker, spends the majority of work hours
6	engaged in the conduct of research, and receives compensation as
7	a research worker."
8	SECTION 5. Section 304A-3005, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"§304A-3005 Research corporation excepted from certain
11	<b>state laws.</b> <u>(a)</u> To carry out the purposes [ <del>and objectives</del> ] of
12	the research corporation[ <del>, including the conduct of research and</del>
13	training projects,] described in section 304A-3001, the research
14	corporation shall be granted flexibility in <u>the</u> hiring <u>of</u> its
15	personnel and [ <del>in</del> ] <u>the</u> handling and [ <del>disbursing</del> ] <u>disbursement of</u>
16	moneys by being excepted from the following state laws:
17	(1) Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund
18	reimbursements to the state general fund;
19	(2) Chapter 103D, relating to advertising for bids and
20	purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever public moneys
21	are expended; provided that the exception shall not





1		apply to bids and purchases of goods and services that
2		are not used for research, training of research
3		personnel, or publication of research findings;
4	[ <del>-(3)</del> -	Chapter 103D with-respect-to construction contracts;
5		provided that the exception shall not apply where
6		state funds are used and compliance with chapter 103D
7		is required by a bill enacted by the legislature;

10	(b)	As used in this section, "research personnel" means

15	SECT	ION 6. Section 304A-3010, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:

18	internal	<b>service orders.</b> (a) Notwithstanding any other law to
19	the contr	ary, the research corporation shall be authorized to
20	set up a	special account for depositing moneys received from
21	either pu	blic or private contracts, or from private or public





1	grants, awards, or gifts[ $ au$ ] relating to research, training, or
2	the promotion or development of the scientific and commercial
3	value of inventions, discoveries, and processes. The provisions
4	of section [ <del>[</del> ]304A-2003[ <del>]</del> ] and other laws to the contrary
5	notwithstanding, this special account may be used to receive,
6	disburse, and account for funds of research and training
7	projects of the [ <del>University</del> ] <u>university</u> of Hawaii, other state
8	agencies, and political subdivisions of the State. All
9	disbursements shall be drawn on the special account upon checks
10	prepared and signed, as approved by the executive director and
11	some other person authorized by the board of directors.
12	(b) Any revolving accounts held by the research
13	corporation shall follow all laws governing the body and
14	policies established by the corporation. The research
15	corporation shall also follow university of Hawaii
16	administrative procedure, AP 12.204, relating to the guidelines
17	and procedures for revolving fund service orders from the
18	university to the research corporation. Within thirty days of
19	the adoption of any amendment to administrative procedure, AP
20	12.204, by the university of Hawaii and the research
21	corporation, the university of Hawaii shall submit a report to



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1	the legislature containing the amended language and a summary of		
2	the amendment.		
3	(c) All internal service orders and revolving accounts of		
4	the research corporation that involve the use of university of		
5	Hawaii intramural funds shall be limited to projects relating		
6	directly to research and training, including projects in which:		
7	(1) Much of the operation will lie outside the State; or		
8	(2) There is a substantial amount of ship operations,		
9	technical shop-type operations, computer services, or		
10	involvement with other research corporation projects;		
11	and shall be reported no later than June 30 and December 31 of		
12	each year to the legislature for financial and mission		
13	compliance according to university of Hawaii and research		
14	corporation policies. The university of Hawaii and the research		
15	corporation shall review and approve all revolving accounts on		
16	an annual basis."		
17	SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the		
18	application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held		
19	invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or		
20	applications of the Act that can be given effect without the		



1 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 2 of this Act are severable. 3 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 4 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024; 5 6 provided that the amendments made to section 304A-3003, Hawaii 7 Revised Statutes, by section 4 of this Act shall apply only to 8 contracts entered into by the research corporation of the 9 university of Hawaii after June 30, 2024.





### Report Title:

RCUH; UH; Purpose; Powers; Exemptions; Contracts for Services

### Description:

Clarifies the purpose of the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii and that its undertakings shall be limited to acts that are reasonably necessary to carry out its purpose. Repeals the requirement that the University of Hawaii contract with the Research Corporation when the University determines that other various agencies cannot more effectively or efficiently accomplish certain research and training activities. Grandfathers existing Research Corporation contracts and requires new contracts be subject to new limitations. Limits the scope of the special account the Research Corporation is authorized to establish. Requires revolving accounts to follow University of Hawaii Administrative Procedure 12.204. Limits internal service orders and revolving accounts of the Research Corporation that use University intramural funds to certain projects and requires biannual reports to the Legislature. (CD2)
