A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COUNTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the International
 Accreditation Service provides objective evidence that an
 organization operates at the highest level of ethical, legal,
 and technical standards. The International Accreditation
 Service accredits a wide range of companies and organizations,
 including governmental entities, commercial businesses, and
 professional associations.

8 The International Accreditation Service accreditation 9 programs are based on recognized national and international standards, such as building and structural standards, that 10 11 ensure domestic and global acceptance of its accreditations. As 12 a result, International Accreditation Service-accredited 13 companies and organizations can improve their processes using 14 input gained from onsite assessment and by learning about best 15 practices from International Accreditation Service assessors and 16 peer evaluators. Furthermore, an International Accreditation 17 Service accreditation can result in reduced cost, time savings,

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and improvement of products and services. Thus, if applied to
 county building codes, an accreditation by the International
 Accreditation Service can enable county building agencies to
 ensure that its buildings meet the best and most currently
 accepted standards.

6 The purpose of this Act is to require each county agency
7 responsible for enforcing its respective building codes to be
8 accredited by the International Accreditation Service.

9 SECTION 2. Each county, other than the county of Kalawao,
10 shall require that the county agency responsible for enforcing
11 its respective building code shall be accredited by the
12 International Accreditation Service.

13 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 14 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 16 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, 17 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure 18 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by

19 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes
20 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal
21 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act

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only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure 1 2 ceiling are that: 3 The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to (1) serve the public interest; and 4 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs 5 addressed by this Act. 6 7 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for a grant-in-aid to each county, other than the county of Kalawao, 10 11 for the county agency responsible for enforcing its respective 12 building code to be accredited by the International Accreditation Service, to be allocated as follows: 13 to the city and county of Honolulu; 14 (1) \$ 15 (2) \$ to the county of Maui; 16 (3) \$ to the county of Hawaii; and to the county of Kauai. 17 (4) \$ 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the counties for 19 the purposes of this Act.

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1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
