RELATING TO CORRECTIONS.

• ; BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII: 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that prison pet programs 2 started in the 1980s as a way to decrease recidivism. Several 3 states, including California and Indiana, have implemented 4 programs that allow inmates to foster animals while 5 incarcerated. Research shows that pet programs improve personal 6 responsibility for inmates; relationships between inmates, 7 prison staff, and administrators; and inmates' self-esteem, 8 self-efficacy, and empathy. Pet programs have also been shown 9 to increase emotional intelligence, coping skills, work ethic, 10 and employability, which improve the chances of job readiness 11 and are critical factors in reducing recidivism. Pet programs 12 also help to address staffing problems in animal shelters by 13 having inmates care for animals and prepare them for adoption. 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to: 15 (1) Require the department of corrections and

rehabilitation to establish a one-year pilot program

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1 to allow inmates incarcerated at the women's community 2 correctional center to foster pets while incarcerated; 3 (2) Require the department of corrections and 4 rehabilitation to submit a report to the legislature; 5 and

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(3) Appropriate funds.

7 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department 8 of corrections and rehabilitation a one-year pilot program to 9 allow inmates incarcerated at the women's community correctional 10 center to foster pets while incarcerated.

11 The department of corrections and rehabilitation may (b) 12 contract with a public or private animal shelter or animal 13 welfare agency to carry out the purposes of this Act. 14 (c) The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations regarding 15 16 the pilot program, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 17 18 the regular session of 2025.

19 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
20 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
21 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the

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1 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, 2 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure 3 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 4 \$ per cent. This current declaration takes or 5 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal 6 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act 7 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure 8 ceiling are that: (1) 9 The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public interest; and 10 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs 11 addressed by this Act. 12 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 15 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to 16 establish a pilot program to allow inmates incarcerated at the 17 women's community correctional center to foster pets while 18 incarcerated; provided that the funds may be used for personnel 19 costs, supplies, and other related expenses to operate the pilot 20 program.

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The appropriation made by this section shall not lapse at
 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriation is made;
 provided that all moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as
 of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
6 corrections and rehabilitation for the purposes of this Act.
7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
