### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERMITS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 187A-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) Notwithstanding the provisions in subtitle 5 of title
4	12, or administrative rules adopted thereunder, the department
5	may issue to any qualified aquaculturist a license to fish,
6	possess, rear, and sell any aquatic life whose fishing,
7	possession or sale is prohibited by closed season, minimum size,
8	or bag limit; provided that [ <del>the</del> ]:
9	(1) The qualified aquaculturist rears or reared the
10	aquatic life in an aquaculture facility[-]; and
11	(2) The department shall approve or deny an application
12	for the permit within ninety days from the date that
13	the application was submitted."
14	SECTION 2. Section 187A-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
16	"(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other law, the
17	department may issue permits, not longer than one year in

1 duration, to any person to take aquatic life  $[\tau]$ ; possess or use fishing gear  $[\tau]$ ; or engage in any feeding, watching, or other 2 3 [such] non-consumptive activity related to aquatic resources, 4 otherwise prohibited by law, in any part of the State, for 5 scientific, educational, management, or propagation purposes, 6 subject to chapter 195D and subject to those restrictions the 7 department deems desirable [-]; provided that the department 8 shall approve or deny an application for the permit within 9 ninety days from the date that the application was submitted. The department may revoke any permit for any infraction of the 10 terms and conditions of the permit. Any person whose permit has 11 been revoked shall not be eligible to apply for another permit 12 13 until the expiration of one year from the date of revocation." 14 In accordance with section 9 of article VII of SECTION 3. 15 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 16 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 17 appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, 18 and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure 19 ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by 20 per cent. This current declaration takes \$ or 21 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal

year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
 ceiling are that:

- 4 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
  5 serve the public interest; and
- 6 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
  7 addressed by this Act.

8 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 11 the establishment of two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) 12 positions within the division of aquatic resources of the 13 department of land and natural resources to support the review 14 process of all aquaculture related licenses.

15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 16 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.

17 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

#### Report Title:

DLNR; Aquaculture Permit; Commercial License; Aquatic Research; DAR; Expenditure Ceiling; Appropriation
