A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 127A-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) [In the event of] If a state of emergency is declared
4 by the governor pursuant to section 127A-14, the governor may
5 exercise the following additional powers pertaining to emergency
6 management during the emergency period:

7 Provide for and require the quarantine or segregation (1)8 of persons who are affected with or believed to have 9 been exposed to any infectious, communicable, or other 10 disease that is, in the governor's opinion, dangerous 11 to the public health and safety, or persons who are 12 the source of other contamination, in any case where, 13 in the governor's opinion, the existing laws are not 14 adequate to assure the public health and safety; 15 provide for the care and treatment of the persons; 16 supplement the provisions of sections 325-32 to 325-38 17 concerning compulsory immunization programs; provide



1 for the isolation or closing of property [which] that 2 is a source of contamination or is in a dangerous 3 condition in any case where, in the governor's opinion, the existing laws are not adequate to assure 4 the public health and safety, and designate as public 5 nuisances acts, practices, conduct, or conditions that 6 7 are dangerous to the public health or safety or to 8 property; authorize that public nuisances be summarily 9 abated and, if [need be,] necessary, that the property 10 be destroyed, by any police officer or authorized 11 person, or provide for the cleansing or repair of 12 property, and if the cleansing or repair is to be at 13 the expense of the owner, the procedure therefor shall 14 follow as nearly as may be the provisions of 15 section 322-2, which shall be applicable; and further, 16 authorize without the permission of the owners or 17 occupants, entry on private premises for any [such 18 purposes;] purpose described herein; 19 (2) Relieve hardships and inequities, or obstructions to 20 the public health, safety, or welfare, found by the

This section 16 shall not limit the power and authority of the governor under 17 section [127A-13(a)(5).] 127A-13(a)(4)." 18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2040.
