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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KALAUPAPA.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 326-25.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]§326-25.5[+] **Annual report.** The department of health  
4 shall submit a report to the legislature no later than twenty  
5 days prior to the convening of each regular session that  
6 addresses the following with regard to Kalaupapa Settlement:

- 7 (1) The department's provision of medical and basic living  
8 needs of the patients;
- 9 (2) The department's progress toward defining and  
10 addressing the nonmedical needs of patients;
- 11 (3) The department's progress toward promoting a positive  
12 living environment;
- 13 (4) The department's management of state resources,  
14 including benefits given to employees that are not  
15 statutorily defined;
- 16 (5) The department's progress toward establishing written  
17 policies and procedures for Kalaupapa store;



- 1           (6) The department's progress toward establishing and
- 2                   maintaining a complaint file and adequately addressing
- 3                   complaints;
- 4           (7) The performance of the administrator, including
- 5                   compliance with job duties;
- 6           (8) The department's progress toward adequate
- 7                   accountability of state property; [and]
- 8           (9) Details and justification of approved employee air
- 9                   travel requests and trail pay[-];
- 10          (10) Details and updated information, as available,
- 11                   regarding the permanent transfer to other governmental
- 12                   or qualified non-governmental entities of the powers
- 13                   and duties of the department and any other state
- 14                   agency over Kalaupapa Settlement; and
- 15          (11) Details, including efforts of engagement by the
- 16                   department with Molokai community groups, including
- 17                   the immediate addition to the transition team of Ka
- 18                   Ohana O Kalaupapa and a non-governmental organization
- 19                   from the non-peninsular area of Molokai as soon as it
- 20                   is selected by the department in consultation with the
- 21                   non-peninsular area of the Molokai community."



1 SECTION 2. After all of the powers and duties of the  
2 department of health over Kalaupapa Settlement have been  
3 permanently transferred to other governmental agencies or  
4 qualified non-governmental organizations, the governor shall  
5 issue a proclamation to affirm the date of completion of the  
6 transfer. The governor shall also immediately deliver a copy of  
7 the proclamation to the revisor of statutes.

8 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000;  
11 provided that on the first June 30 that occurs after the revisor  
12 of statutes receives a copy of the governor's proclamation, as  
13 described in section 2 of this Act, section 1 of this Act shall  
14 be repealed and section 326-25.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall  
15 be reenacted in the form in which it read on the day prior to  
16 the effective date of this Act.



**Report Title:**

DOH; Kalaupapa; Reports; Transfer; Powers; Duties; Community Engagement

**Description:**

Requires the Department of Health to include in its annual report regarding Kalaupapa Settlement details and updated information, as available, regarding the permanent transfer to other governmental or qualified non-governmental entities of the powers and duties of state agencies over Kalaupapa Settlement. Requires the Department of Health to report on its community engagement efforts. Sunsets on the first 6/30 after the Revisor of Statutes receives a written gubernatorial proclamation that the referenced transfer is complete. Effective 7/1/3000. (HD1)
