A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the safety and 2 prosperity of our aging kupuna, especially those who require 3 long-term care, are priorities of the State. The legislature 4 further finds that several islands of the State, such as Molokai 5 and Lanai, have very little to zero resources or facilities for 6 long-term care patients. As a result, long-term care patients 7 on these islands are required to travel to other islands to 8 receive the treatment and services they need, which is a 9 burdensome process for the elderly and their families. 10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to: 11 Require the director of the executive office on aging (1)12 to work with health care providers to ensure that 13 there are sufficient long-term care facilities on each 14 island of the State; and 15 (2) Make an appropriation. SECTION 2. Section 349-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16

17		policy initiatives and conduct such liaison as would
18		be required to implement them;
19	(5)	Serve as a member of advisory boards and regulatory
20		panels of state agencies in such areas as income
21		maintenance, public employment, retirement systems,



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1		certification of health care facilities and programs,
2		social service and medical assistance, and housing and
3		employment, among others;
4	(6)	Administer funds allocated for the executive office on
5		aging; and apply for, receive, and disburse grants and
6		donations from all sources for elder programs and
7		services;
8	(7)	Establish a clearinghouse for complaints of persons
9		regarding services to elders, or operations of state
10		and county agencies affecting elders, investigate the
11		complaints, and refer the complaints and the
12		director's findings to the appropriate agency for
13		corrective action;
14	(8)	Work with health care providers to ensure that there
15		are sufficient long-term care facilities on each
16		island of the State in alignment with the state master
17		plan for elders pursuant to section 349.6;
18	[.(8)]	(9) Adopt, amend, and repeal rules pursuant to
19		chapter 91 for the purposes of this chapter;



1 [(9)] (10) Employ and retain [such] staff as may be necessary for the purposes of this chapter, in 2 conformity with chapter 76; and 3 $\left[\frac{10}{10}\right]$ (11) Contract for or grant [such] services as may be 4 5 necessary for the purposes of this chapter, including master contract with other state agencies receiving 6 7 federal and state funds for programs and services for the aging, and purchase of service agreements with 8 9 appropriate agencies." 10 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 11 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 12 13 the executive office of aging to work with health care providers to ensure that there are sufficient long-term care facilities on 14 15 each island of the State. 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the executive 17 office on aging for the purposes of this Act. 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
