A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that state agricultural 1 lands are a key resource that can be used to meet the State's 2 3 goals for economic diversification and food self-sufficiency. In order to support farmers on these lands, the State subsidizes 4 5 lessees by providing the leases below market rates and, in some cases, providing lower-cost agricultural water. Despite these 6 7 state subsidies, some state agricultural leases are used primarily as residences or non-agricultural businesses or are 8 9 unused.

10 The legislature further finds that lessees who obtain a state agricultural lease in high-demand locations can transfer 11 12 the remainder of their lease to the highest bidder, thereby converting their lease into a windfall profit above and beyond 13 14 their investment in the property. This windfall profit is an unintended transfer of wealth from the State to individual 15 lessees. This situation also causes the transfers of leases to 16 17 the highest bidder, who may or may not be the farmers best able

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1 to use the land for agricultural production. The legislature believes that further data is needed to assess to what extent 2 3 the department of agriculture leases maximize the benefit to the 4 State of these lands to help the State achieve its economic and food production goals. Further data is also needed to assess 5 6 whether the transfer of state lands from one lessee to another 7 results in the difference between the actual value of the lease and the subsidized price of the lease being monetized for 8 9 private, rather than State, benefit.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the board of agriculture to submit a report on the percentages of agricultural lands being leased by the State that are suitable for farming and actively being used for farming purposes and certain dollar amounts relating to lease transfers between lessees.

16 SECTION 2. The board of agriculture shall submit to the 17 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 18 the regular session of 2025 a report of:
