BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1.	Section 323D-1	2, Hawaii	Revised	Statutes,	is

5	(1)	Have as a principal function the responsibility for
6		promoting [accessibility for all-the people of the
7		State to quality health care services at reasonable
8		cost. The state agency shall conduct such studies and
9		investigations as may be necessary as to the causes of

11		agency may contract for services to implement this
12		paragraph. The certificate of need program mandated
13		under part V shall serve this function. The state
14		agency shall promote the sharing of facilities or
15		services by health-care providers whenever-possible to
16		achieve economies and shall restrict unusual or
17		unusually costly services to individual facilities or



1		providers where appropriate;] universal access to high
2		quality, equitable, and affordable health care for all
3		people in the State; provided that, for purposes of
4		this section, "health care" means the improvement of
5		health via the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and
6		amelioration or cure of disease, illness, injury, and
7		other physical and mental impairments, that are
8		delivered in any setting;
9	(2)	[Serve as staff to and provide technical assistance
10		and advice to the statewide council and the subarea
11		councils in the preparation, review, and revision of
12		the state health services and facilities plan;]
13		Provide leadership and coordination of activities and
14		resources for state agencies that affect health care
15		access and quality, including but not limited to
16		health insurance coverage rates, health insurance
17		benefits, affordability, workforce, reimbursement,
18		quality, administrative simplification, and health
19		information technology;
20	(3)	[Conduct the health planning activities of the State
21		in coordination with the subarea councils, implement

2		determine the statewide health needs of the State
3		after consulting with the statewide council; and]
4		Prepare a state health services and facilities plan,
5		which shall include workforce considerations, and
6		update the plan every four years, after consulting
7		with the statewide council;
8	(4)	Administer the state certificate of need program
9		pursuant to part V $[-]$ and serve as staff and provide
10		technical assistance and advice to the statewide
11		council and subarea councils; and
12	(5)	Develop, no later than 2027, and annually thereafter,
13		and in consultation with the governor, the department
14		of budget and finance, the employee-union trust fund,
15		all public and private health plans and entities in
16		the State providing health insurance coverage, an
17		annual state global budget based on total costs of
18		health care in order to prevent costs from rising
19		faster than general inflation and to assure the
20		affordability of health care services.

8		limited to[$_{ au}$] a review of health insurance plans, the
9		availability of various kinds of health insurance and
10		malpractice insurance to consumers, and strategies for
11		increasing competition in the health insurance
12		field[\div] and across the health care delivery system;
13	[(2)	Prepare-and revise as necessary the state-health
14		services and facilities plan.
15	(3)	Prepare, review, and revise-the annual-implementation
16		plan.
17	(4)]	(2) Assist the statewide council in the performance

19	[(5)]	(3) Determine the need for new health services
20		proposed to be offered within the State $[+]$;

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 $\left[\frac{(6)}{(4)}\right]$ (4) Assess existing health care services and 1 facilities to determine whether there are redundant, 2 excessive, or inappropriate services or facilities and 3 make public findings of any that are found to be so. 4 The state agency shall weigh the costs of the health 5 care services or facilities against the benefits the 6 services or facilities provide and there shall be a 7 negative presumption against marginal services [-]; 8 [(7)] (5) Provide technical assistance to persons, public 9 or private, in obtaining and filling out the necessary 10 forms for the development of projects and programs [-]; 11 [(8)] (6) Prepare reports, studies, and recommendations on 12 emerging health issues, such as medical ethics, health 13 care rationing, involuntary care, care for the 14 indigent, and standards for research and development 15 16 of biotechnology [and], genetic engineering [-], remote 17 monitoring, and artificial intelligence; and 18 [(9)] (7) Conduct [such] other activities as are necessary 19 to meet the purposes of this chapter." SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 20 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 21



f 1 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the

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appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
and this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by

5 \$ or per cent. This current declaration takes 6 into account general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal 7 year 2024-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act 8 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure 9 ceiling are that:

- 10 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to11 serve the public interest; and
- 12 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs13 addressed by this Act.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for administrative costs and the establishment of the following positions within the state health planning and development agency:

8		VI position, to serve as the State health planner;
9	(5)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
10		IV position, to serve as health planning liaison for
11		the county of Hawaii;
12	(6)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
13		IV position, to serve as health planning liaison for
14		the county of Kauai;
15	(7)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
16		IV position, to serve as health planning liaison for
17		the county of Maui; and
18	(8)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
19		IV position, to serve as health planning liaison for
20		the city and county of Honolulu.



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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 health for the purposes of this Act.
