# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BURIAL SITES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to impose a fine of	
2	\$1,000 on	any private landowner who:	
3	(1)	Fails to disclose and record the existence of burial	
4		sites or archaeological sites on their property to the	
5		bureau of conveyances that the landowner knew or	
6		should have known of; and	
7	(2)	Fails to record their property with the Hawaii	
8		register of historic places prior to or concurrently	
9		with a real estate transaction when the landowner knew	
10		or should have known that an obligation existed.	
11	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 508D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
13	and to read as follows:		
14	" <u>§50</u>	8D- Failure to record or disclose a burial site,	
15	archaeolo	gical site, or historic property; penalty. There shall	
16	be impose	d a fine of \$1,000 on any landowner who:	



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(1)	Fails to disclose and record with the bureau of
	conveyances burial or archaeological sites located on
	the landowner's property that the landowner knew of or
	should have known of; or
(2)	Fails to record their property with the Hawaii
	register of historic places prior to or concurrently
	with a real estate transaction when the landowner knew
	of or should have known that an obligation existed."

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#### Report Title:

Bureau of Conveyances; Burial Sites; Private Property; Landowners

### Description:

Imposes a fine on any landowner that fails to disclose or record the existence of burial sites or archaeological sites on their property to the Bureau of Conveyances that the landlord knew or should have known of. Imposes a fine on any landowner that fails to record their property with the Hawaii Register of Historic Places prior to or concurrent with a real estate transaction when they knew or should have known that an obligation existed.
