A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CULTURE AND ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the aloha order of 2 merit was established to recognize individuals who have made significant contributions and achieved national or international 3 4 recognition in a field either by a single event or by the 5 totality of work that has either been pioneering in that field 6 or that has been outstanding in the long term. The legislature 7 also finds that many exceptional and notable individuals are deserving of recognition specifically for their contributions to 8 9 Hawaii. While the aloha order of merit honors individuals who 10 have made national and international contributions and achieved 11 recognition, there should be a similar program to honor 12 individuals who have made their mark on Hawaii.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish the Hawaii leadership awards program to honor Hawaii individuals who have made considerable and outstanding contributions to Hawaii in their respective fields and serve as inspirations to others.

6	(c) The governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the
7	Hawaii leadership awards selection committee, or its designees,
8	shall present the awards to awardees annually. No individual
9	shall receive more than one award per category per year.
10	(d) Each awardee shall:
11	(1) Receive a certificate of honor and medal;
12	(2) Have the awardee's story and a statement of
13	recognition displayed in a conspicuous place for a
14	period of one year; and
15	(3) Have the awardee's name added to a permanent archive
16	of awardee names.
17	(e) Awardees shall be selected by a Hawaii leadership
18	awards selection committee. The selection committee shall
19	comprise the following members or their designees:
20	(1) The lieutenant governor;

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1	(2)	The chairperson of the senate standing committee
2		having jurisdiction over culture and arts; and
3	(3)	The chairperson of the house of representatives

6	<u>(f)</u>	Nominations for awardees shall be accepted by the
7	Hawaii le	adership awards selection committee from the public.
8	<u>(g)</u>	There is established within the state archives a
9	permanent	archive of the awardees work and achievements,

11	documents	of their work."
