A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 agriculture's agricultural land use baseline study has indicated 3 that the total amount of agricultural land in the State has 4 decreased by twenty-seven thousand fifty acres since 2015, or 5 three per cent. Put another way, tens of thousands of 6 agriculturally zoned lands have moved out of agricultural 7 production. The legislature finds that this is a concerning 8 trend that must be addressed.

9 The legislature further finds that lands supporting viable 10 agricultural activities should be maintained in agricultural use 11 by bona fide farmers or ranchers. Unfortunately, the State's 12 agricultural workforce is aging. A recent article in Hawaii 13 Business Magazine indicated that the average age of a farmer in 14 Hawaii is approximately sixty years. Because younger 15 generations in farming families are often reluctant to take over 16 family farms, many farmlands in the State are at risk of falling

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1 fallow, which would further decrease the amount of agriculturally zoned lands in active agricultural production. 2 3 The legislature finds that succession planning is a process 4 by which business owners plan to exit their business and 5 transition ownership and control of the business to a successor 6 owner. Although succession planning can be a difficult process, 7 it can be vital to ensuring the success of exiting owners, 8 successor owners, and the businesses themselves. 9 The legislature further finds that because the agribusiness 10 development corporation is one of the primary agencies 11 responsible for addressing the business component of the State's 12 agricultural sector, it is the most appropriate agency to 13 educate farmers and ranchers on the benefits of succession 14 planning. The legislature further finds that the agribusiness 15 development corporation would also be an ideal agency to 16 facilitate involvement in succession planning education 17 activities by landowners, county land use and permitting officials, state taxation authorities, and other stakeholders to 18 19 ensure a smooth transition of agricultural enterprises between 20 exiting owners and their successors.

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1	Finally, the legislature finds that a succession planning
2	education program could also provide an opportunity for the
3	agribusiness development corporation to connect individuals
4	interested in entering farming or ranching with farmers and
5	ranchers who have not yet identified a successor owner. These
6	types of proactive efforts will help greatly in keeping valuable
7	agricultural lands in agricultural production.
8	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
9	(1) Require the agribusiness development corporation to
10	develop a succession planning education program; and
11	(2) Appropriate moneys to develop the program.
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 163D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
14	and to read as follows:
15	" <u>§163D-</u> Succession planning education program. (a) The
16	corporation shall develop a succession planning education
17	program to educate and assist farmers and ranchers in the
18	process of transitioning agricultural businesses to new owners
19	who intend to maintain the transitioned assets, including
20	agricultural lands, in agricultural production. The program
21	shall:

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1	(1)	Educate farmers and ranchers on the importance of
2		succession planning;
3	(2)	Connect farmers and ranchers with succession planning
4		resources; and
5	(3)	If a farmer or rancher does not have a successor
6		identified, help to connect the farmer or rancher
7		with:
8		(A) Persons who are interested in entering the
9		farming or ranching business as bona fide farmers
10		or ranchers; or
11		(B) Existing bona fide farmers or ranchers who are
12		interested in expanding their business,
13		and connect the parties with resources to help
14		facilitate the transfer of the agricultural assets,
15		including agricultural lands, to ensure that the
16		assets remain in agricultural production.
17	(b)	For purposes of this program, the corporation shall
18	collabora	te with:
19	(1)	The department of agriculture and private landowners
20		that lease agricultural land in the State to assist

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1		exiting farmers and ranchers in planning for lease	
2		transfers; and	
3	(2)	The department of taxation; county land use and	
4		permitting agencies; and other relevant state and	
5		county agencies to assist exiting farmers and ranchers	
6		meet any requirements necessary to transfer an	
7		agricultural business and keep the business's assets,	
8		including agricultural land, in agricultural	
9		production."	
10	SECT	ION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of	
11	the Hawai	i State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,	
12	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the	
13	appropriations contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,		
14	and this 2	Act will cause the state general fund expenditure	
15	ceiling fo	or fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by	
16	\$	or per cent. This current declaration takes	
17	into acco	unt general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal	
18	year 2024	-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act	
19	only. The	e reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure	
20	ceiling a	re that:	

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1	(1)	The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
2		serve the public interest; and
3	(2)	The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
4		addressed by this Act.
5	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
6	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much
7	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
8	agribusin	ess development corporation to develop a succession
9	planning	education program for farmers and ranchers.
10	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the agribusiness
11	developme	nt corporation for the purposes of this Act.
12	SECT	ION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2060.

Report Title:

Agribusiness Development Corporation; Agriculture; Succession Planning; Education Program; Expenditure Ceiling; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the Agribusiness Development Corporation to develop a program to educate and assist farmers and ranchers in the process of transitioning agricultural businesses to new owners. Requires the program to connect individuals interested in entering farming or ranching, or existing farmers or ranchers interested in expanding their business, with farmers and ranchers who have not yet identified a successor owner. Declares that the general fund expenditure ceiling is exceeded. Makes an appropriation. Takes effect 1/1/2060. (SD1)

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
