A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a sustainable food
system is one in which producers, retailers, community members,
non-governmental organizations, and government agencies partner
to create a vibrant and resilient local food economy that
enhances and sustains the environmental, economic, and social
health of the community.

7 The legislature further finds that the development of a 8 more sustainable food system for Hawaii represents an 9 opportunity to create a new food economy that integrates the 10 objectives of "green" job creation, sustainable economic 11 development, land stewardship, food security, environmental 12 protection, and climate change resiliency with community health 13 and well-being.

14 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within 15 the department of agriculture the sustainable food systems 16 working group to:

Develop an interagency food systems plan;

4	(3)	Draft a proposed state farm bill for consideration by
5		the legislature.
6	SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established within the department
7	of agricu	lture the sustainable food systems working group. The
8	working g	roup shall:
9	(1)	Develop an interagency food systems plan linked to the
10		United Nations Sustainable Development Goals for a
11		more sustainable, resilient local food economy that
12		enhances and sustains the environmental, economic, and
13		social health of the community. The plan shall
14		include the identification of a governance structure
15		and a plan for implementation;
16	(2)	Assess whether a state farm bill that is modeled after
17		the federal farm bill should be developed and enacted
18		in the State; and
19	(3)	Draft a proposed state farm bill for consideration by
20		the legislature.



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1	(b)	The sustainable food systems working group shall be
2	composed	of the following members:
3	(1)	One member of the house of representatives, to be
4		selected by the speaker of the house of
5		representatives;
6	(2)	One member of the senate, to be selected by the
7		president of the senate;
8	(3)	A representative of the Hawaii tourism authority, to
9		be selected by the president and chief executive
10		officer of the Hawaii tourism authority;
11	(4)	Two representatives of the university of Hawaii system
12		who have experience in food systems, to be selected by
13		the dean of the college of tropical agriculture and
14		human resources;
15	(5)	A representative of the department of agriculture, to
16		be selected by the chairperson of the board of
17		agriculture;
18	(6)	A representative of the department of health, to be
19		selected by the director of health;

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1	(7)	A representative of the office of Hawaiian affairs, to
2		be selected by the chairperson of the board of
3		trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs;
4	(8)	A representative of the office of climate change,
5		sustainability and resiliency of the city and county
6		of Honolulu, to be selected by the chief resilience
7		officer and executive director of the office of
8		climate change, sustainability and resiliency of the
9		city and county of Honolulu;
10	(9)	The food access coordinators of the city and county of
11		Honolulu and the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai;
12	(10)	A representative of the department of Native Hawaiian
13		health of the John A. Burns school of medicine of the
14		university of Hawaii, to be selected by the chair of
15		the department of Native Hawaiian health;
16	(11)	Two persons with familiarity, experience, or expertise
17		in the Native Hawaiian community, to be selected by
18		the chairperson of the board of agriculture; provided
19		that one of the members shall be a resident of a
20		county other than the city and county of Honolulu;



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1	(12)	A representative of the Hawaii Farm Bureau, to be
2		selected by the president of the Hawaii Farm Bureau;
3	(13)	A representative of the Hawaii Foodbank, to be
4		selected by the president and chief executive officer
5		of the Hawaii Foodbank;
6	(14)	A representative of the agricultural sector, to be
7		selected by the chairperson of the board of
8		agriculture;
9	(15)	Four farmers, each of whom shall respectively
10		represent one of the counties of Hawaii, Kauai, or
11		Maui, or the city and county of Honolulu, and who
12		shall be selected by the chairperson of the board of
13		agriculture;
14	(16)	Four representatives of the agricultural sector, each
15		of whom shall respectively represent one of the
16		counties of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, or the city and
17		county of Honolulu, and who shall be selected by the
18		respective mayor of each county;
19	(17)	A representative of the farm-to-school community in
20		Hawaii, to be selected by the chairperson of the board
21		of agriculture;



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1	(18)	A representative of the Hawaii Foodservice Alliance,
2		to be selected by the owner of the Hawaii Foodservice
3		Alliance;
4	(19)	A representative of the Hawaii Food Industry
5		Association, to be selected by the executive director
6		of the Hawaii Food Industry Association;
7	(20)	A representative of the Hawaii Farmers Union United,
8		to be selected by the president of the Hawaii Farmers
9		Union United;
10	(21)	A representative of the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council,
11		Inc., to be selected by the president of the Hawaii
12		Cattlemen's Council, Inc.;
13	(22)	A representative of the Hawaii Fishermen's Alliance
14		for Conservation and Tradition, to be selected by the
15		president of the Hawaii Fishermen's Alliance for
16		Conservation and Tradition; and
17	(23)	A representative of the commercial fishing sector of
18		the State, to be selected by the administrator of the
19		division of aquatic resources of the department of
20		land and natural resources.

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1	(c)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture shall
2	serve as	chair of the sustainable food systems working group.
3	(d)	The interagency food systems plan shall:
4	(1)	Address the following:
5		(A) Food as a human right and healthy food for all;
6		(B) Social equity and food justice;
7		(C) Food system resilience;
8		(D) Agriculture and food system sustainability;
9		(E) Food at the center of a circular economy;
10		(F) Sustainable education, workforce development, and
11		fair labor; and
12		(G) Good food governance; and
13	(2)	Incorporate the county food access plans.
14	(e)	The sustainable food systems working group shall meet
15	on a rota	tional basis as follows:
16	(1)	One-half of the working group's members shall meet for
17		the first five months;
18	(2)	The other half of the working group's members shall
19		meet for the second five-month period; and



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1 (3) The entire working group shall meet during the remaining time to reconcile any differences and 2 3 finalize the submissions required by subsection (f). The sustainable food systems working group shall 4 (f) 5 submit: The interagency food systems plan and any 6 (1)7 recommendations for implementation of the plan, 8 including any proposed legislation; and 9 (2) The assessment of the necessity of developing a state 10 farm bill and a proposed state farm bill, 11 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 12 convening of the regular session of 2026. 13 The department of agriculture shall provide any (q) 14 necessary staff support, including support for the preparation of the interagency food systems plan identified in subsection 15 16 (a), to the sustainable food systems working group. 17 (h) The sustainable food systems working group shall be 18 dissolved on June 30, 2026. 19 (i) For the purpose of this Act, "federal farm bill" means 20 the comprehensive, omnibus, multiyear law enacted by Congress 21 that governs agricultural and food programs and serves as a



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primary agricultural and food policy instrument for the federal
government.

SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and 4 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined 5 6 that the appropriations contained in this Act will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 7 8 to be exceeded by \$, or per cent. The reasons 9 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the 10 appropriations made in this Act are necessary to serve the 11 public interest and to meet the needs provided for by this Act. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 12 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to 14 15 establish the sustainable food systems working group and to implement section 2 of this Act, including coordinating 16 stakeholder meetings; managing public meetings and website data 17 in accordance with chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes; writing 18 19 and printing the interagency food systems plan; drafting a 20 proposed state farm bill; and potentially obtaining services for 21 a fee.



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1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 2 agriculture for the purposes of this Act; provided that the 3 appropriation made by this section shall not lapse at the end of 4 the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is made; 5 provided further that all moneys from the appropriation 6 unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date. 7 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 10 the establishment of full-time equivalent (FTE) 11 sustainability specialist position in the department of 12 agriculture.

13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 14 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

15 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024. 16

Description:

Establishes the sustainable food systems working group within the Department of Agriculture. Requires the working group to develop an interagency food systems plan and a state farm bill. Appropriates funds for the working group and for an unspecified number of sustainability specialist positions to be employed by the Department of Agriculture. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.
