BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The reasons for 2 exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the 3 appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public 4 interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act. 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the 8 purposes of this Act. 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 10 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of this Act. 11 12 SECTION 4.
