A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COUNTY OF MAUI.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an average of more
- 2 than 8,700,000 gallons of treated waste water is disposed of
- 3 every day using injection wells on the island of Maui. This
- 4 method of disposal causes groundwater contamination, algae
- 5 blooms, and coral reef damage in nearshore waters. To prevent
- 6 and mitigate these damages and prevent further environmental
- 7 harm, the legislature believes that additional infrastructure is
- 8 needed for treatment, distribution, and storage of reclaimed
- 9 water for subsequent use. The legislature further finds that
- 10 the most desirable use for reclaimed water is for the irrigation
- 11 of agricultural lands and landscaping, and emergency
- 12 firefighting.
- The legislature notes that in August 2023, wildfires on
- 14 Maui burned more than an estimated seventeen thousand acres of
- 15 land, including most of the historic town of Lahaina, killed at
- 16 least one hundred people, and injured and traumatized many more.
- 17 Providing firefighters with access to stored reclaimed water



- 1 with which to fight fires will increase public safety, protect
- 2 affected lands, and save lives. Further, due to its levels of
- 3 salinity, the use of salt water to fight fires alters the
- 4 chemical composition of the affected soil. For example, the
- 5 introduction of saline from seawater to topsoil creates barren
- 6 landscapes that are unable to support native plant life and
- 7 intensifies erosion, which helps to carry salinized soil to
- 8 other areas.
- 9 The legislature recognizes that water is a valued commodity
- 10 and should not be disposed of without careful consideration.
- 11 The legislature believes that without increasing the use of
- 12 reclaimed water in the State, residents will encounter potable
- 13 drinking water shortages caused by the overuse of potable
- 14 drinking water for agricultural, landscaping, or firefighting
- 15 purposes. The legislature also finds that using former
- 16 plantation reservoirs to store reclaimed water will allow for
- 17 easier access for agriculture and landscaping use for West Maui
- 18 and will provide firefighters with efficient access to fresh
- 19 water.

1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the
2	director of finance to issue general obligation bonds to the
3	agribusiness development corporation for the upgrade of:
4	(1) The R-1 water delivery systems in South and West Maui;
5	and
6	(2) Water reservoirs located in the forest watershed areas
7	of South and West Maui.
8	SECTION 2. The director of finance is authorized to issue
9	general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
0	thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
1	as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2024-2025

12	SECTION 3. The appropriation made for the capital
13	improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
14	the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
15	made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
16	unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.
17	SECTION 4. The agribusiness development corporation shall
18	collaborate with the department of land and natural resources,
19	county of Maui, and private landowners, as necessary, to
20	effectuate the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

Description:

Authorizes the Director of Finance to issue general obligation bonds to the Agribusiness Development Corporation for the upgrade of South and West Maui's R-1 water delivery systems, and the upgrade of certain water reservoirs located in the forest watershed areas of South and West Maui. Requires the Agribusiness Development Corporation to collaborate with the Department of Land and Natural Resources, County of Maui, and private land owners, as necessary. Appropriates moneys.
