## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAUI'S PERMANENT HOUSING RECOVERY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, as one of the
largest landowners on the island of Maui, the State must be
proactive in coordinating planning and development efforts among
public agencies to maximize the benefits derived from the
development and redevelopment of Maui's public lands.

6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to ensure that the 7 State has a unified vision and approach toward the development 8 and redevelopment of public lands on the island of Maui by 9 establishing an interagency council for Maui housing recovery 10 within the department of business, economic development, and 11 tourism to coordinate effective and efficient housing 12 development and redevelopment of state and county lands on Maui. 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 201H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding two new sections to part I to be appropriately 15 designated and to read as follows:

## 16 "<u>§201H-</u> Hawaii interagency council for Maui housing

17 recovery; established. (a) There shall be established the

11	(b)	The Hawaii interagency council for Maui housing
12	recovery	shall:
13	(1)	Serve as the State's primary Maui housing recovery
14		planning and policy development entity, with
15		representation from the state and county governments
16		and the community;
17	(2)	Formulate a strategic plan to address Maui's housing
18		recovery projects, including mixed-use, affordable,
19		and rental housing projects on Maui's state and county
20		lands, and advise the governor and mayor of the county
21		of Maui on the implementation of the strategic plan;



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1	(3)	Facilitate the acquisition of funding and resources
2		for state and county housing recovery programs,
3		including affordable and rental housing projects on
4		Maui's state and county lands;
5	(4)	Monitor the preparation and administration of plans
6		and studies relating to state and county housing
7		recovery plans prepared pursuant to this section,
8		including but not limited to the preparation of site
<b>. 9</b>		or master plans and implementation plans and studies;
10	(5)	Review all capital improvement project requests to the
11		legislature for housing recovery projects, including
12		mixed-used, affordable, and rental housing projects,
13		on Maui's state and county lands;
14	(6)	Recommend policy, regulatory, and statutory changes,
15		and identify resource strategies for the successful
16		execution of the strategic plan described in
17		paragraph (2);
18	(7)	Assemble accurate fiscal and demographic information
19		to support policy development and track outcomes;
20	(8)	Consider collaborative housing recovery initiatives in
21		other states that have demonstrated positive outcomes;



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1	(9)	To the greatest extent possible, work with Maui-based
2		businesses; and
3	(10)	Report annually to the governor, legislature, and
4		mayor of the county of Maui on the progress of its
5		activities, including formulation and progress on the
6		strategic plan described in paragraph (2), no later
7		than twenty days prior to the convening of each
8		regular session of the legislature.
9	(c)	The strategic plan developed by the Hawaii interagency
10	council f	or Maui housing recovery shall:
11	(1)	Provide for coordination with the county on housing
12		development;
13	(2)	Compile an inventory of state, county, and private-
14		sector housing projects that lack infrastructure;
15		identify the type of infrastructure each project
16		lacks; and provide the approximate timeframe when
17		additional infrastructure capacity is needed;
18	(3)	Prioritize the development and redevelopment of
19		housing recovery projects, including mixed-use,
20		affordable, and rental housing projects, on Maui's
21		state and county lands;

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1	(4)	Identify financing, and prioritize state financing
2	<u> </u>	requests, for public infrastructure, facilities, and
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3		service investments required to support housing
4		recovery development, including mixed-use, affordable,
5		and rental housing projects; and
6	(5)	Encourage and promote partnerships between public and
7		private entities to identify and secure affordable
8		housing options on state and county lands, including
9		through renovation projects.
10	(d)	A majority of members present at any noticed public
11	meeting s	hall constitute a quorum for the Hawaii interagency
12	council f	or Maui housing recovery to do business.

15	<u>Maui hous</u>	ing recovery shall be composed of the following

19		chairperson;
20	(2)	The chairperson of the Hawaiian homes commission, who
21		shall serve as co-vice chairperson;



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1	(3)	The executive director of the Hawaii public housing
2		authority, who shall serve as co-vice chairperson;
3	(4)	The chief of staff of the office of the governor;
4	(5)	The director of finance;
5	(6)	The director of business, economic development, and
6		tourism;
7	(7)	The director of the office of planning and sustainable
8		development;
9	(8)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
10		resources;
11	(9)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture;
12	(10)	The director of transportation;
13	(11)	The comptroller;
14	(12)	The director of health;
15	(13)	The director of human services;
16	(14)	The executive director of the school facilities
17		authority;
18	(15)	The superintendent of education;
19	(16)	The executive director of the Hawaii community
20		development authority;

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1	(17)	One member, to be invited by the president of the
2		senate;
3	(18)	One member, to be invited by the speaker of the house
4		of representatives;
5	(19)	The state disaster recovery coordinator and the
6		recovery support functions identified by the governor,
7		with their corresponding state leads;
8	(20)	The mayor of the county of Maui;
9	(21)	The director of environmental management of the county
10		of Maui;
11	(22)	The director of finance of the county of Maui;
12	(23)	The director of fire and public safety of the county
13		of Maui;
14	(24)	The director of housing and human concerns of the
15		county of Maui;
16	(25)	The director of planning of the county of Maui;
17	(26)	The director of public works of the county of Maui;
18	(27)	The director of transportation of the county of Maui;
19	(28)	The director of water supply of the county of Maui;
20	(29)	One member of the Maui county council to be designated
21		by the chairperson of the Maui county council;



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1		provided that the chairperson of the council may
2		designate a second member of the council to serve as
3		an alternate;
4	(30)	A Hawaiian cultural advisor, who shall be invited to
5		serve by the governor;
6	(31)	Two representatives of the Maui community, who shall
7		be invited to serve by the governor; provided that one
8		member shall represent the community of Lahaina;
9	(32)	A representative of the Maui business community, who
10		shall be invited to serve by the governor;
11	(33)	A representative of the Maui community who is a
12		housing advocate, who shall be invited to serve by the
13		governor;
14	(34)	A representative of the Maui community with experience
15		in housing and real estate development, who shall be
16		invited to serve by the governor;
17	(35)	A representative of the Honolulu field office of the
18		United States Department of Housing and Urban
19	·	Development, who shall be invited to serve by the
20		governor as a nonvoting member;

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1	(36)	A representative of the Hawaii field office of the
2		United States Department of Agriculture, Rural
3		Development, who shall be invited to serve by the
4		governor as a nonvoting member; and
5	(37)	A representative of the Honolulu field office of the
6		United States Small Business Administration, who shall
7		be invited to serve by the governor as a nonvoting
8		member.
9	(b)	The nongovernmental members of the Hawaii interagency
10	council f	or Maui housing recovery shall serve without
11	compensat	ion but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses,
12	including	reasonable travel expenses, necessary for the
13	performan	ce of their duties.
14	(c)	Except as provided in subsection (a)(29), if a member
15	of the Ha	waii interagency council for Maui housing recovery is
16	unable to	attend a meeting, that member may appoint a designee
17	to attend	and act on the member's behalf during the meeting."
18	SECT	ION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
19	the Const	itution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
20	37-93, Ha	waii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
21	that the	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the

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state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 1 2 to be exceeded by \$ , or per cent. The reasons 3 for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the 4 appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public 5 interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act. SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 7 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to carry 9 out the purposes of this Act and to assist the state and Maui 10 county agencies in applying for federal loans and grants. 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of 12 13 this Act. 14 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000, and 15 16 shall be repealed on June 30, 2034.
