### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ROSE-RINGED PARAKEETS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the rose-ringed
 parakeet is an invasive bird that adversely affects agricultural
 production on Kauai. Rose-ringed parakeets are herbivores that
 feed mainly on fruits and grains, such as lychee, mango, papaya,
 longan, corn, and other citrus products. Their large flocks and
 voracious appetites cause damage to valuable food crops.

7 The legislature further finds that rose-ringed parakeets 8 harm native ecosystems by spreading invasive seeds, displacing 9 other native birds, and spreading avian disease. Their roosting 10 behavior, loud calls, and accumulated droppings are detrimental 11 to local communities and resort destinations.

12 The legislature also finds that in 2021, the population of 13 rose-ringed parakeets on Kauai was 12,500, with projections for 14 exponential growth in their numbers.

15 The legislature additionally finds that based on studies 16 completed by the United States Department of Agriculture's 17 National Wildlife Research Center in 2023, roost culling is the

1 most effective method to remove large numbers of rose-ringed 2 parakeets. Since 2020, the county of Kauai has periodically 3 culled rose-ringed parakeets successfully at known roosting 4 areas.

5 Furthermore, the legislature finds that a sustained, yearlong pilot program to reduce the population of rose-ringed 6 7 parakeets by roost culling is needed to provide relief to Kauai 8 famers, enhance visitor destinations, and reduce public-health 9 concerns. The Kauai rose-ringed parakeet working group will 10 take the research conducted to implement culling outside of 11 nesting season, use thermal imaging to reduce roost abandonment, 12 and implement a new web-based survey that includes a mapping 13 component so that community members can report their 14 observations of rose-ringed parakeets.

15 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds 16 to establish a one-year pilot program to reduce the population 17 of rose-ringed parakeets on Kauai using past research and on-18 the-ground experience to guide future strategies.

19 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much
21 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for a one-

year pilot program to reduce the population of invasive rose ringed parakeets on Kauai using past research and on-the-ground
 experience to guide future strategies (LNR402, native resources
 and fire protection program).

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of6 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 7 8 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93, 9 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the 10 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be 11 12 exceeded by \$ per cent. In addition, the or 13 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further 14 exceeded by \$150,000 or per cent. The combined total 15 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these 16 17 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling 18 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
