A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while new business 2 formations have grown by thirty-seven per cent in Hawaii since 3 the beginning of 2020, this rate is well below the national average and among the bottom ten nationally. In the latest 4 5 comprehensive entrepreneurial study from the Kauffman 6 Foundation, the early survival rate for startups in Hawaii is 7 the lowest in the country. Self-employment in Hawaii has 8 consistently been lower than in the United States as a whole, 9 and in 2020, Hawaii ranked fortieth for the percentage of 10 self-employed individuals.

11 The legislature further finds that tax rates are a factor 12 in business investment decisions and often affect the movement 13 of individuals. Recent reports show both companies and 14 individuals are more likely to move to a location with lower 15 taxes. Hawaii currently ranks the sixth highest for state and 16 local taxes per capita and was ranked forty-second for business 17 climate by the Tax Foundation.
