## A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FOOD SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the department of 4 5 education is required to provide meal service for its students 6 and staff. The department provides approximately twenty 7 thousand school breakfasts and eighty thousand school lunches on 8 a daily basis to students and staff across the State. However, 9 the department of education has accumulated a deficit of more 10 than \$20,000,000 for its food service operations, which is 11 largely due to inflationary cost increases. In the 2022-2023 12 school year, more than eighty per cent of the department's food 13 costs increased by forty-two per cent, resulting in the need for 14 additional funds.

15 For many students, a school meal is their only regular16 source of food for their growing bodies and minds. School meals



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are required to follow strict federal food safety and nutrition
 guidelines, which ensure quality meals. The department of
 education plays a vital role in the health and well-being of
 youth in the State's communities.

5 While students and staff are required to pay for their
6 meals, Title I students are provided meals free of charge.
7 However, because school meals are critical for student
8 development, students are not denied meals due to a lack of
9 payment.

10 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to make an emergency 11 appropriation to the department of education for its food 12 service fiscal deficit and to continue to provide public school 13 students with high-quality, nutritious meals.

14 SECTION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of 15 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and 16 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined 17 that the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2023-18 2024 has already been exceeded by \$ or per cent. 19 The appropriations contained in this Act will cause the state 20 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2023-2024 to be 21 further exceeded by \$ or per cent. This

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declaration takes into account the additional general fund
 appropriation authorized for fiscal year 2023-2024 in this Act
 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
 ceiling are that:

- 5 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
  6 serve the public interest; and
- 7 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs8 addressed by this Act.

9 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 to
12 provide funding for the department of education to cover its
13 food service operations.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 education for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
