A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY AEROMEDICAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that most rural
 communities have fewer healthcare resources compared to
 residents on Oahu, including access to advanced levels of trauma
 care, medical specialists, and sub-specialists. This puts
 patients in these underserved areas at greater risk of poor
 outcomes for serious medical conditions such as heart attack,
 stroke, and traumatic bodily injury.

8 The existing system of interisland transport of patients 9 for healthcare services is overburdened. The State is currently 10 served by only one interisland aeromedical provider, for which 11 there are few viable and cost-effective alternatives in the 12 event of a grounding, for example, due to maintenance issues or 13 crew availability. Emergency aeromedical services are not 14 available for many patients in rural counties.

15 Therefore, the legislature further finds that such 16 disruptions to interisland medical transports pose a risk to 17 human health and safety, and that the consistent availability of

interisland medical transport and the overall resiliency of
 emergency aeromedical services must be improved.

3 One model may be based on the county of Maui's medevac 4 service. Act 213, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, appropriated 5 general funds for the purchase of a helicopter for the county of 6 Maui emergency aeromedical services program, established in 7 2003, which is currently equipped with a twin-engine helicopter capable of medical transport between Maui and Oahu. 8 The 9 department of health cost shares the helicopter with the county 10 of Maui. The department bills for services and private sector 11 entities are contracted to provide the pilots, aircraft 12 maintenance technicians, and the medical flight staff.

13 The legislature finds that reliable aeromedical transport 14 is essential. The Maui model is suitable to meet the needs of 15 the State.

16 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to ensure the 17 availability of air ambulance services through an emergency 18 aeromedical services program with the department of health and 19 in cooperation with rural counties.

20 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 amended by adding to part XVIII a new section to be
22 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

1	(c) The county of Kauai, the county of Maui, and the
2	county of Hawaii shall submit to the department all necessary
3	information for purposes of submitting claims for third-party
4	reimbursement within thirty days of the service for any
5	emergency aeromedical services provided. Funds received from
6	reimbursements shall be deposited into the emergency medical
7	services special fund, pursuant to section 321-234.
8	(d) The department shall establish statewide standards for
9	the emergency aeromedical services partnership program
10	consistent with this part and applicable federal regulations for
11	those services.
12	(e) The director of health may adopt rules pursuant to
13	chapter 91 to effectuate the purposes of this section.
14	(f) No later than January 4, 2026, the department shall
15	adopt interim rules, which shall be exempt from chapter 91 and
16	chapter 201M, to effectuate the purposes of this section;
17	provided that the interim rules shall remain in effect until
18	July 1, 2028, or until rules are adopted pursuant to subsection
19	(e), whichever occurs sooner.
20	(g) The department may amend the interim rules, and the
21	amendments shall be exempt from chapters 91 and 201M, to
22	effectuate the purposes of this chapter; provided that any

1 amended interim rules shall remain in effect until July 1, 2028, 2 or until rules are adopted pursuant to subsection (e), whichever 3 occurs sooner." 4 SECTION 3. Section 321-232, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 6 The department shall establish reasonable fees for "(a) 7 services rendered to the public within the service area by the department, any county within the service area, or private 8 9 agency under this part; provided that all revenues collected by 10 the department and the respective counties pursuant to this 11 section shall be deposited into the state general fund, except 12 [amounts]: 13 (1) Amounts necessary to provide for collection services

17 Fees required to be set by this section shall be established in 18 accordance with chapter 91."

19 SECTION 4. Section 321-234, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows: 21 "(b) The moneys in the special fund shall be distributed 22 as follows:

1 contributions from private or public sources for the purposes of 2 the fund, and revenues collected for emergency aeromedical services, shall be deposited into the special fund." 3 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$18,000,000 or so 5 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the emergency medical services special fund. 7 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the emergency 8 medical services special fund the sum of \$18,000,000 or so much 9 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the establishment of the emergency aeromedical services partnership 11 12 program. Report Title:

Emergency Aeromedical Services Partnership Program; Established; DOH; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes an Emergency Aeromedical Services Partnership Program to be administered by the Department of Health in counties with a population less than 500,000. Requires costsharing for program operations and maintenance and revenue sharing between the State and the County of Hawaii, the County of Kauai, and the County of Maui. Authorizes deposits into the Emergency Medical Services Special Fund. Requires rulemaking.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Health

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMERGENCY AEROMEDICAL SERVICES.

PURPOSE: To establish an emergency aeromedical services program within the Department of Health to ensure greater access to aeromedical transport for patients; require a memorandum of agreement between the State and the County of Kauai, the County of Maui, and the County of Hawaii to implement and maintain the program; and share revenues from reimbursement with participating counties.

MEANS: Add a new section to part XVIII of chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), amend section 321-232(a), HRS, and amend section 321-234(b) and (c), HRS.

Most rural communities have fewer healthcare JUSTIFICATION: resources compared to residents on Oahu, including the advanced levels of trauma care, medical specialists, and subspecialists. This is aggravated by inadequate access to affordable and immediate interisland medical transport due to the lack of emergency aeromedical services providers based in the County of Kauai and the County of Hawaii. A service similar to the partnership between the State and the County of Maui to provide emergency aeromedical services that supplements existing services provided by the private sector will improve access.

> <u>Impact on the public:</u> This bill will provide improved access to medical care for serious conditions such as heart attack, stroke, traumatic bodily injury, and other conditions for which local health care providers are unable to sufficiently treat due to remote location or inadequate medical resources.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The Department of Health is required to promulgate administrative rules to establish standards for the emergency aeromedical services partnership program. The County of Kauai, the County of Maui, and the County of Hawaii are required to provide funds for operations, including flight crew and medical staff.
