S.B. NO. 312

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE WORKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a strong child care and early education workforce is necessary to support Hawaii's children, working families, and communities. The demand for quality child care and early education far exceeds the number of gualified child care and early education professionals currently available in the State, hindering efforts to maintain and expand quality, affordable child care and early education programs.

8 The purpose of this Act is to establish, administer, and 9 appropriate funds for a two-year child care worker subsidy pilot 10 program to retain the existing early child care workforce in 11 licensed infant and toddler centers.

SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services shall establish and administer a two-year infant and toddler child care worker subsidy pilot program to retain the existing early child care workforce in licensed infant and toddler centers.

16 (b) The department of human services shall establish17 standards and qualifications for participation in the pilot

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1 program established in subsection (a); provided that 2 participation shall be: Available to all lead caregivers, caregivers, and 3 (1)child care aides working in licensed infant and 4 5 toddler centers; Prohibited to child care workers employed by the 6 (2) 7 department of education, state public charter school commission, or an Early Head Start provider; and 8 9 (3) Limited to child care workers working in licensed 10 infant and toddler centers. 11 The department of human services shall establish best (c) practices to establish a minimum wage of \$16.00 per hour for all 12 13 pilot program participants. 14 The department of human services may convene and (d) consult community members to establish best practices, policies, 15 16 and procedures regarding administering the pilot program, 17 including but not limited to the development of salary schedules 18 and educational requirements. 19 (e) The department of human services shall submit annual 20 reports on the development and administration of the pilot 21 program established in subsection (a), including impacts to



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infant and toddler child care center operators and staff, and
 any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than
 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of
 2024, 2025, and 2026.

(f) The department of human services shall submit a final
report on the pilot program established in subsection (a),
including impacts to infant and toddler child care center
operators and staff, and any proposed legislation, to the
legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
the regular session of 2027.

11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 14 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 15 year 2024-2025 for the infant and toddler child care worker 16 subsidy pilot program established pursuant to section 2 of this 17 Act.

18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 19 of human services for the purposes of this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023, and
 shall repeal on June 30, 2027.
