A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER INFRASTRUCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the quality of the
- 2 environment and the economy of the State are both of utmost
- 3 importance to the welfare of the people of Hawaii. The
- 4 legislature, in concert with the United States Environmental
- 5 Protection Agency (EPA) and the United States Congress, finds
- 6 that there is increasing demand for the replacement of aging
- 7 drinking water and wastewater system infrastructure in the
- 8 State, the delay of which could pose short-term and long-term
- 9 health hazards for consumers statewide.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the drinking water
- 11 treatment revolving loan fund and the water pollution control
- 12 revolving fund have been administered by the department of
- 13 health in ways that manage yearly capitalization grants
- 14 received from the EPA, but not to the maximum extent allowed
- 15 under the Safe Drinking Water Act, P.L. 93-523, preventing the
- 16 construction of health-protective infrastructure projects in
- 17 Hawaii.

- 1 The legislature additionally finds that the incorporation
- 2 of capitalization grant transfer authority between the
- 3 drinking water treatment revolving loan fund and the water
- 4 pollution control revolving fund programs, as currently
- 5 allowed under title 40 Code of Federal Regulations section
- 6 35.3530(c), can greatly assist the two programs with
- 7 additional planning and priority setting; maximizing of the
- 8 two infrastructure funding programs by directing federal funds
- 9 where they are most needed; and ensuring that annual federal
- 10 capitalization grant moneys awarded to the two programs will
- 11 be disbursed as quickly as possible.
- 12 The restoration of Lahaina and other communities impacted
- 13 by wildfires or other natural disasters would benefit from the
- 14 ability to utilize the transfer authority between the programs
- 15 to replace or repair drinking water, wastewater, or stormwater
- 16 infrastructure.
- 17 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the
- 18 department of health to transfer federal capitalization grant
- 19 funds in accordance with federal law.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 340E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part III to be
3	appropriately designated and to read as follows:
4	"§340E- Drinking water treatment revolving loan fund;
5	transfers. The director may transfer up to thirty-three per
6	cent of a fiscal year's drinking water treatment revolving
7	loan fund capitalization grant amount to the water pollution
8	control revolving fund established under section 342D-83, or
9	an equivalent dollar amount from the water pollution control
10	revolving fund to the drinking water treatment revolving loan
11	fund, established under section 340E-35. The following
12	conditions shall apply:
13	(1) Each year in which the director transfers funds
14	<pre>pursuant to this section:</pre>
15	(A) The attorney general, or attorney general's
16	designee, shall certify in writing that state law
17	permits the director to transfer funds between the
18	drinking water treatment revolving loan fund and
19	the water pollution control revolving fund; and
20	(B) The director shall amend the operating agreements
21	or other parts of the capitalization grant

1		agreements for the drinking water treatment
2		revolving loan fund and the water pollution
3		control revolving fund to document the method used
4		to transfer funds;
5	(2)	The director shall not use the transfer provision to
6		acquire state match for either fund or use transferred
7		funds to secure or repay state match bonds;
8	(3)	The director may reserve fund amounts for transfer in
9		future years pursuant to requirements under federal
10		law; and
11	(4)	Funds may be transferred on a net basis between the
12		drinking water treatment revolving loan fund and the
13		water pollution control revolving fund; provided
14		that the thirty-three per cent transfer allowance
15		associated with drinking water treatment revolving
16		loan fund capitalization grants received is not
17		exceeded."
18	SECT	ION 3. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended b	y adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
20	designate	ed and to read as follows:

1	" <u>§342</u> D-	Water pollution control revolving fund;
2	transfers.	The director may transfer up to thirty-three per
3	cent of a fis	cal year's water pollution control revolving fund
4	capitalizatio	n grant amount to the drinking water treatment
5	revolving loa	n fund established under section 340E-35, or an
6	equivalent do	llar amount from the drinking water treatment
7	revolving loa	n fund to the water pollution control revolving
8	fund establis	hed under section 342D-83. The following
9	conditions sh	all apply:
10	<u>(1)</u> Each	year in which the director transfers funds
11	purs	uant to this section:
12	<u>(A)</u>	The attorney general, or attorney general's
13		designee, shall certify in writing that state law
14		permits the director to transfer funds between the
15		drinking water treatment revolving loan fund and
16		the water pollution control revolving fund; and
17	<u>(B)</u>	The director shall amend the operating agreements
18		or other parts of the capitalization grant
19		agreements for the drinking water treatment
20		revolving loan fund and water pollution control

1		revolving fund to document the method used to
2		transfer funds;
3	(2)	The director shall not use the transfer provision to
4		acquire state match for either fund or use transferred
5		funds to secure or repay state match bonds;
6	(3)	The director may reserve fund amounts for transfer in
7		future years pursuant to requirements under federal
8		law; and
9	(4)	Fund amounts may be transmitted on a net basis
10		between the water pollution control revolving fund
11		and the drinking water treatment revolving loan fund;
12		provided that the thirty-three per cent transfer
13		allowance associated with water pollution control
14		revolving fund capitalization grants received is not
15		exceeded."
16	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
