A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 27-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§27-8 Contracts for food; percentage to be grown within 4 the State. (a) The department of education, department of 5 health, department of corrections and rehabilitation, department 6 of defense, and University of Hawaii system shall each ensure 7 that a certain percentage of the food purchased for public 8 schools, youth campuses, public hospitals, public prisons, and 9 any purchases made directly by the University of Hawaii for use 10 in its academic programs, as applicable, is fresh local 11 agricultural products and local value-added, processed, 12 agricultural, or food products, as follows:

13 (1) By January 1, 2025, fresh local agricultural products
14 and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
15 food products shall constitute a minimum of ten per
16 cent of the total food purchased during each calendar
17 year, as measured by the per cent of total food cost;



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1 (2) By January 1, 2030, fresh local agricultural products 2 and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or 3 food products shall constitute a minimum of eighteen 4 per cent of the total food purchased during each 5 calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total 6 food cost; 7 (3) By January 1, 2035, fresh local agricultural products 8 and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or 9 food products shall constitute a minimum of twenty-six 10 per cent of the total food purchased during each 11 calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total 12 food cost;

13 (4) By January 1, 2040, fresh local agricultural products
14 and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
15 food products shall constitute a minimum of thirty16 four per cent of the total food purchased during each
17 calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
18 food cost;

19 (5) By January 1, 2045, fresh local agricultural products
20 and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
21 food products shall constitute a minimum of forty-two



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1		per cent of the total food purchased during each
2		calendar year, as measured by the per cent of total
3		food cost; [and]
4	(6)	By January 1, 2050, fresh local agricultural products
5		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
6		food products shall constitute a minimum of fifty per
7		cent of the total food purchased during each calendar
8		year, as measured by the per cent of total food
9		cost [-] ; and
10	(7)	By January 1, 2112, fresh local agricultural products
11		and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or
12		food products shall constitute one hundred per cent of
13		the total food purchased during each calendar year, as
14		measured by the per cent of total food cost."
15	(b)	The department of education, department of health,
16	departmen	t of corrections and rehabilitation, department of
17	defense,	and University of Hawaii system shall each submit a
18	report to	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
19	convening	of each regular session on progress made toward
20	meeting t	he benchmarks described in subsection (a), including:

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The total cost of food purchased during the calendar 1 (1) 2 year preceding that regular session, or in the case of 3 the department of education, during the school year preceding that regular session; 4 The percentage of the total cost of food purchased (2) 5 during the calendar year preceding that regular 6 session, accounted for by the total cost of fresh 7 8 local agricultural products and local value-added, 9 processed, agricultural, or food products purchased, 10 or in the case of the department of education, during 11 the school year preceding that regular session; and 12 (3) If the department or University of Hawaii system did 13 not meet the relevant benchmark described in 14 subsection (a), an explanation of why the department 15 or University of Hawaii system did not meet that 16 benchmark. 17 The department of agriculture shall consider and (C) 18 examine: Fresh local agricultural products and local value-19 (1) 20 added, processed, agricultural, or food products that 21 could substitute the food purchased by the department

4	benchmarks described in subsection (a); and
5	(2) New technologies that could allow for the cultivation
6	of agricultural products, such as wheat, in the State.
7	[(c)] <u>(d)</u> As used in this section:
8	"Fresh local agricultural products" means fruits,
9	vegetables, nuts, coffee, eggs, poultry and poultry products,
10	livestock and livestock products, milk and milk products,
11	aquacultural and maricultural products, and horticultural
12	products, that are one hundred per cent grown, raised, and
13	harvested in Hawaii.
14	"Local value-added, processed, agricultural, or food
15	products" means a product for which at least fifty-one per cent
16	of its primary agricultural product is grown, raised, and
17	harvested in Hawaii.
18	"Primary agricultural product" means the major agricultural
19	product in a processed or value-added agricultural or food
20	product."

Description:

Requires that, by 1/1/2112, one hundred percent of the food purchased by certain state departments consist of fresh local agricultural products and local value-added, processed, agricultural, or food products. Requires the Department of Agriculture to consider substitutes and new technology that would assist certain state departments to meet the benchmarks on purchasing fresh local agricultural products and local valueadded, processed, agricultural, or food products. Takes effect 7/1/2112. (SD1)
