A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I	
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is	
3	responsible for upholding an ethical position on the deterrence	
4	of conflicts of interest, bribery, and corruption in all	
5	branches of government. When government is idle about	
6	combatting corruption, this can erode public trust and	
7	confidence for state leaders and exacerbate social tensions,	
8	which could contribute to violence.	
9	The purpose of this Act is to:	
10	(1) Require that justices, judges, and judicial nominees	
11	file the same financial disclosures that are required	
12	of other state officials, which will help prevent	
13	bribery and corruption; and	
14	(2) Require the commission on salaries to consider the	
15	deterrence of bribery and corruption when making its	
16	salary recommendations.

2	SECT	ION 2. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
4	"(C)	The following persons shall file annually with the
5	state eth	ics commission a disclosure of financial interests:
6	(1)	The governor, lieutenant governor, members of the
7		legislature, and delegates to the constitutional
8		convention; provided that delegates to the
9		constitutional convention shall only be required to
10		file initial disclosures;
11	(2)	The directors and their deputies, the division chiefs,
12		the executive directors and the executive secretaries
13		and their deputies, the purchasing agents, and the
14		fiscal officers, regardless of the titles by which the
15		foregoing persons are designated, of every state
16		agency and department;
17	(3)	The permanent employees of the legislature and its
18		service agencies, other than persons employed in
19		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
20	(4)	The administrative director of the State, and the
21		assistants in the office of the governor and

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1		lieutenant governor, other than persons employed in
2		clerical, secretarial, or similar positions;
3	(5)	The hearings officers of every state agency and
4		department;
5	(6)	The president, vice presidents, assistant vice
6		presidents, chancellors, and provosts of the
7		University of Hawaii and its community colleges;
8	(7)	The superintendent, deputy superintendent, assistant
9		superintendents, complex area superintendents, state
10		librarian, and deputy state librarian of the
11		department of education;
12	(8)	[The] <u>Justices, judges, and the</u> administrative
13		director and deputy director of the courts;
14	(9)	The members of every state board or commission whose
15		original terms of office are for periods exceeding one
16		year and whose functions are not solely advisory;
17	(10)	Candidates for state elective offices, including
18		candidates for election to the constitutional
19		convention; and nominees for justices and judges;
20		provided that candidates and nominees shall only be
21		required to file initial disclosures;



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1	(11)	The administrator and assistant administrator of the
2		office of Hawaiian affairs;
3	(12)	The Hawaii unmanned aerial systems test site chief
4		operating officer; and
5	(13)	The members of the school facilities board appointed
6		by the governor."
7		PART III
8	SECT	ION 3. Section 26-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
10	"(b)	The commission shall review and recommend an
11	appropria	te salary for the governor, lieutenant governor,
12	members o	f the legislature, justices and judges of all state
13	courts, a	dministrative director of the State or an equivalent
14	position,	and department heads or executive officers and the
15	deputies	or assistants to the department heads of the
16	departmen	ts of:
17	(1)	Accounting and general services;
18	(2)	Agriculture;
19	(3)	The attorney general;
20	(4)	Budget and finance;
21	(5)	Business, economic development, and tourism;



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1	(6)	Commerce and consumer affairs;
2	(7)	Corrections and rehabilitation;
3	(8)	Defense;
4	(9)	Hawaiian home lands;
5	(10)	Health;
6	(11)	Human resources development;
7	(12)	Human services;
8	(13)	Labor and industrial relations;
9	(14)	Land and natural resources;
10	(15)	Law enforcement;
11	(16)	Taxation; and
12	(17)	Transportation.
13	The	commission shall not review the salary of any position
14	in the de	partment of education or the University of Hawaii.
15	The	commission may recommend different salaries for
16	departmer	t heads and executive officers and different salary
17	ranges fo	or deputies or assistants to department heads; provided
18	that the	commission shall recommend the same salary range for
19	deputies	or assistants to department heads within the same
20	departmer	t; provided further that the appointing official shall



1	specify the salary for a particular position within the
2	applicable range.
3	In making its salary recommendations for each position, the
4	commission shall consider the deterrence of bribery and
5	corruption.
6	The commission shall not recommend salaries lower than
7	salary amounts recommended by prior commissions replaced by this
8	section."
9	PART IV
10	SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
11	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
12	begun before its effective date.
13	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
16	provided that that the amendments made to section 84-17, Hawaii
17	Revised Statutes, by section 2 of this Act shall not be repealed
18	when that section is amended on January 1, 2025, pursuant to
19	sections 1 and 4 of Act 123, Session Laws of Hawaii 2023.
