### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT.

#### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
human resources development is committed to filling state civil
service vacancies from our local workforce, including recent
graduates of Hawaii high schools, community colleges, and
universities.

6 The legislature also finds that there is a recognized need 7 for the department of human resources development to collaborate 8 with the department of education and the university of Hawaii 9 system in reducing the loss of qualified potential employees, or "brain drain", by reassessing and updating the minimum 10 11 qualification requirements for civil service jobs, mapping 12 certificate and degree requirements to state jobs, and promoting 13 career opportunities in state government to recent graduates. 14 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate 15 moneys and resources to the department of human resources 16 development to:



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1	(1)	Establish and manage a state internship program to
2		provide a glide path for graduates into state civil
3		service jobs;
4	(2)	Establish and fund three permanent full-time
5		equivalent (3.0 FTE) human resources specialist V
6		positions; and
7	(3)	Establish and fund fifty full-time equivalent intern
8		positions to be filled and deployed to state executive
9		branch departments to facilitate the transition to
10		civil service positions.
11	SECTION 2. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of	
12	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and	
13	37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined	
14	that the appropriation contained in this Act will cause the	
15	state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025	
16	to be exceeded by \$ , or per cent. The reasons	
17	for exceeding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the	
18	appropriation made in this Act is necessary to serve the public	
19	interest and to meet the need provided for by this Act.	
20	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
21	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$213,048 or so much	



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thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for the
establishment of three permanent full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE)
human resources specialist V positions within the department of
human resources development.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of6 human resources development for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to fund operating, equipment, supplies, promotional materials, marketing, advertising, training, and travel costs for up to fifty intern positions to implement and manage the intern glide path program.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 15 human resources development for the purposes of this Act.

16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.

#### Report Title:

DHRD; Internship Program; General Fund Expenditure Ceiling Exceeded

#### Description:

Appropriates moneys to the Department of Human Resources Development to establish 3.0 permanent, full-time equivalent human resources specialist positions and to establish fifty full-time equivalent intern positions and funds to provide equipment, supplies, promotional materials, marketing, advertising, training, and travel necessary to implement and manage the intern glide path program. Appropriates moneys. Declares that the appropriation exceeds the state general fund expenditure ceiling for 2024-2025.

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
