A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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PART I

2 The legislature finds that there are multiple SECTION 1. state agencies responsible for housing. Having so many separate 3 agencies creates redundancies and bureaucracies that hinder the 4 5 work of solving Hawaii's housing crisis. The purpose of this 6 Act is to consolidate the Hawaii housing finance and development 7 corporation, Hawaii community development authority, Hawaii 8 public housing authority, and office of planning and sustainable 9 development into a new department of housing. 10 PART II SECTION 2. Chapter 26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 11 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 12 13 read as follows: 14 "§26- Department of housing. (a) The department of housing shall be headed by a single executive to be known as the 15

16 director of housing.

Section 26-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 9 "(b) The following are placed in the department of 10 business, economic development, and tourism for administrative 11 purposes as defined by section 26-35: [Hawaii community 12 development authority, Hawaii housing finance and development 13 corporation, Hawaii technology development corporation, natural 14 energy laboratory of Hawaii authority, and any other boards and 15 commissions as shall be provided by law." · . 16 SECTION 6. Section 26-52, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 "§26-52 Department heads and executive officers. The 19 salaries of the following state officers shall be as follows: 20 The salary of the superintendent of education shall be (1) 21 set by the board of education at a rate no greater



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1 than \$250,000 a year. Effective July 1, 2007, and every six years 6 thereafter, the salary of the adjutant general shall 7 be as last recommended by the commission on salaries 8 pursuant to section 26-56, unless rejected by the 9 legislature, except that if the state salary is in 10 conflict with the pay and allowance fixed by the 11 tables of the regular Army or Air Force of the United 12 States, the latter shall prevail." 13 SECTION 7. Section 201H-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 15 "(a) There is established the Hawaii housing finance and 16 development corporation to be placed within the department of 17 [business, economic development, and tourism] housing for 18 administrative purposes only. The corporation shall be a public 19 body and a body corporate and politic." 20 SECTION 8. Section 201H-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 21

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1 "(a) There is created a board of directors of the Hawaii 2 housing finance and development corporation consisting of nine members, of whom six shall be public members appointed by the 3 4 governor as provided in section 26-34. At least four of the 5 public members shall have knowledge and expertise in public or 6 private financing and development of affordable housing. Public 7 members shall be appointed from each of the counties of 8 Honolulu, Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai. At least one public member 9 shall represent community advocates for low-income housing, 10 affiliated with private nonprofit organizations that serve the 11 residents of low-income housing. The public members of the 12 board shall serve four-year staggered terms; provided that the 13 initial appointments shall be as follows: 14 (1) Two members to be appointed for four years; 15 (2) Two members to be appointed for three years; and 16 Two members to be appointed for two years. (3) 17 The director of [business, economic development, and tourism] 18 housing and the director of finance, or their designated 19 representatives, and a representative of the governor's office, 20 shall be ex officio[{],[}] voting members. The corporation shall 21 be headed by the board.

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1 (b) The board of directors shall select a chairperson and 2 vice chairperson from among its members; provided that the 3 chairperson shall be a public member. The director of 4 [business, economic development, and tourism,] housing, director of finance, and the governor's representative shall be 5 ineligible to serve as chairperson of the board." 6 7 SECTION 9. Section 206E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 8 9 "(a) There is established the Hawaii community development 10 authority, which shall be a body corporate and a public 11 instrumentality of the State, for the purpose of implementing 12 this chapter. The authority shall be placed within the 13 department of [business; economic development, and tourism] 14 housing for administrative purposes. 15 The authority shall consist of the director of finance (b) 16 or the director's designee; the director of transportation or the director's designee; the director of [business, economic 17 development, and tourism] housing or the director's designee; 18 19 the chairperson of the board of land and natural resources; the director of planning or planning and permitting of each county 20 21 in which a community development district is located or the

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1 director's designee; a cultural specialist; an at-large member 2 nominated by the president of the senate; an at-large member 3 nominated by the speaker of the house of representatives; two representatives of the Heeia community development district, 4 5 comprising one resident of that district or the Koolaupoko 6 district, which consists of sections 1 through 9 of zone 4 of 7 the first tax map key division, and one owner of a small 8 business or one officer or director of a nonprofit organization 9 in the Heeia community development district or Koolaupoko 10 district; two representatives of the Kalaeloa community development district, comprising one resident of the Ewa zone 11 12 (zone 9, sections 1 through 2) or the Waianae zone (zone 8, 13 sections 1 through 9) of the first tax map key division, and one 14 owner of a small business or one officer or director of a 15 nonprofit organization in the Ewa or Waianae zone; two 16 representatives of the Kakaako community development district, 17 comprising one resident of the district and one owner of a small 18 business or one officer or director of a nonprofit organization 19 in the district; and two representatives of the Pulehunui 20 community development district, consisting of one resident of 21 the island of Maui, and one owner of a small business or one

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officer or director of a nonprofit organization on the island of
 Maui.

3 All members except the director of finance, director of 4 transportation, county directors of planning or planning and 5 permitting, director of [business, economic development, and 6 tourism, housing, chairperson of the board of land and natural 7 resources, or their respective designees shall be appointed by 8 the governor pursuant to section 26-34. The two at-large 9 members nominated by the president of the senate and speaker of 10 the house of representatives shall each be invited to serve and 11 appointed by the governor from a list of three nominees 12 submitted for each position by the nominating authority specified in this subsection. 13

14 The president of the senate and the speaker of the house of 15 representatives shall each submit a list of six nominees for 16 each district to the governor to fill the two district 17 representative positions for each community development 18 district. For each community development district, the governor 19 shall appoint one member from a list of nominees submitted by 20 the president of the senate and one member from a list of 21 nominees submitted by the speaker of the house of

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1 representatives, and of the two appointees, one shall meet the 2 district residency requirement and one shall meet the district small business owner or nonprofit organization officer or 3 4 director requirement. ÷ 5 The authority shall be organized and shall exercise 6 jurisdiction as follows: 7 (1) For matters affecting the Heeia community development 8 district, the following members shall be considered in determining quorum and majority and shall be eligible 9 10 to vote: The director of finance or the director's 11 (A) 12 designee; The director of transportation or the director's 13 (B) 14 designee; The director of [business, economic development, 15 (C) and tourism] housing or the director's designee; 16 17 (D) The director of planning and permitting for the county in which the Heeia community development 18 district is located or the director's designee; 19 20 The cultural specialist; (E) The two at-large members; and 21 (F)

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1 director of [business, economic development, and tourism;] housing; and chairperson of the board of land and natural 2 3 resources; or their respective designees shall run concurrently 4 with each official's term of office. The terms of the appointed 5 voting members shall be for four years, commencing on July 1 and 6 expiring on June 30. The governor shall provide for staggered 7 terms of the initially appointed voting members so that the 8 initial terms of four members selected by lot shall be for two 9 years, the initial terms of four members selected by lot shall 10 be for three years, and the initial terms of the remaining three members shall be for four years. 11

12 The governor may remove or suspend for cause any member13 after due notice and public hearing.

Notwithstanding section 92-15, a majority of all eligible
voting members as specified in this subsection shall constitute
a quorum to do business, and the concurrence of a majority of
all eligible voting members as specified in this subsection
shall be necessary to make any action of the authority valid.
All members shall continue in office until their respective
successors have been appointed and qualified. Except as herein



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1 provided, no member appointed under this subsection shall be an 2 officer or employee of the State or its political subdivisions. 3 For purposes of this section, "small business" means a 4 business that is independently owned and that is not dominant in 5 its field of operation." 6 SECTION 10. Section 225M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 "§225M-1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to 9 establish an office of planning and sustainable development to 10 assist the governor; the director of housing; the director of 11 business, economic development, and tourism; the legislature; 12 and state and county agencies in maintaining an overall 13 framework to guide the development of the State through a 14 continuous process of comprehensive, long-range, and strategic 15 planning to meet the physical, economic, and social needs of 16 Hawaii's people, and provide for the wise use of Hawaii's 17 resources in a coordinated, efficient, and economical manner, 18 including the conservation of those natural, environmental, 19 recreational, scenic, historic, and other limited and 20 irreplaceable resources which are required for future 21

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generations.

1 The establishment of an office of planning and sustainable 2 development in the department of [business, economic 3 development, and tourism, housing, for administrative purposes, is intended to: 4 Fix responsibility and accountability to successfully 5 (1)carry out statewide planning programs, policies, and 6 : 7 priorities; 8 Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the (2)9 operations of the executive branch; and 10 Ensure comprehensive planning and coordination to (3) 11 enhance the quality of life of the people of Hawaii." 12 SECTION 11. Section 225M-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 14 "(a) There is established the office of planning and 15 sustainable development within the department of [business, 16 economic development, and tourism] housing for administrative 17 purposes only. The head of the office shall be known as the 18 director of the office of planning and sustainable development 19 and referred to in this chapter as director. The director shall 20 have:

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1 (1)Training in the field of urban or regional planning, 2 public administration, or other related fields; 3 (2) Experience in programs or services related to 4 governmental planning; and 5 (3) Experience in a supervisory, consultative, or 6 administrative capacity. 7 The director shall be nominated by the governor and, by and with 8 the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor 9 without regard to chapter 76, and shall be compensated at a 10 salary level set by the governor. The director shall be 11 included in any benefit program generally applicable to the 12 officers and employees of the State. The director may retain 13 staff as may be necessary for the purposes of this chapter, in 14 conformity with chapter 76. The director shall report to the 15 director of [business, economic development, and tourism] 16 housing and shall not be required to report directly to any 17 other principal executive department. The director may also 18 employ staff without regard to chapter 76, as authorized in this 19 chapter and as may be necessary."

20 SECTION 12. Section 225M-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

The executive heads of all state 6 departments and agencies shall cooperate with the office of 7 planning and sustainable development by providing information as 8 the governor and the director of [business, economic 9 development, and tourism] housing deem necessary for the 10 effective discharge of its duties." 11 SECTION 13. Section 225M-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended to read as follows: 13 "§225M-4 Allocation of funds. Any of the agencies of the 14 State to which general or special appropriations are made, or a 15 part of whose budget contains an allocation, or which makes an 16 allocation of funds for planning and research, shall consult 17 with the office of planning and sustainable development to 18 ensure that all expenditures are in accordance with, or in 19 furtherance of the goals and objectives of the Hawaii state 20 plan. After first consulting with the director of [business, 21 economic development, and tourism,] housing, the governor may

The director of 18 housing may prescribe the duties and qualifications of these 19 employees and fix their salaries without regard to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 20

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All rules, policies, procedures, quidelines, and other 1 (C) 2 material adopted or developed by the transferred agencies to implement provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes that are 3 reenacted or made applicable to the department of housing by 4 this Act shall remain in full force and effect until amended or 5 6 repealed by the department of housing pursuant to chapter 91, 7 Hawaii Revised Statutes. In the interim, every reference to the 8 department of business, economic development, and tourism and 9 department of human services as they pertain to the transferred agencies in those rules, policies, procedures, guidelines, and 10 other material is amended to refer to the department of housing, 11 12 as appropriate.

13 (d) All deeds, leases, contracts, loans, agreements, permits, or other documents executed or entered into by or on 14 behalf of the department of business, economic development and 15 tourism and the department of human services as they pertain to 16 17 the transferred agencies, pursuant to the provisions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes that are reenacted or made applicable to 18 the department of housing by this Act shall remain in full force 19 and effect: Effective July 1, 2023, every reference to the 20 21 department of business, economic development and tourism and the

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department of human services as they pertain to the transferred
 agencies in those deeds, leases, contracts, loans, agreements,
 permits, or other documents shall be construed as a reference to
 the department of housing.

(e) All appropriations, records, equipment, machines, 5 6 files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents, maps, and 7 other personal property heretofore made, used, acquired, or held 8 by the department of department of business, economic development and tourism and the department of human services 9 10 relating to the functions transferred to the department of housing shall be transferred with the functions to which they 11 12 relate.

13 SECTION 19. This Act does not affect rights and duties 14 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that 15 were begun before its effective date.

16 SECTION 20. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

18 SECTION 21. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023,
19 provided that section 17 of this Act shall take effect on
20 January 1, 2024.
