A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to rea	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 457	7- Temporary permit. (a) The board may issue a
5	temporary	permit to a practical nurse or registered nurse
6	licensed i	in another jurisdiction who:
7	(1)	Completes an application on a form prescribed by the
8		board;
9	(2)	Pays all applicable fees to the board as prescribed by
10		administrative rules;
11	(3)	Provides proof of a valid and unencumbered license in
12		another state, territory, or country by way of a
13		license verification from the other state, territory,
14		or country, or Nursys license verification report as
15		prescribed by administrative rules;
16	(4)	Completes the fingerprinting requirement for a federal
17		and state criminal record check; and



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1	(5)	Submits a certified copy of the self-query report
2		issued by the National Practitioner Data Bank to the
3		board.
4	(b)	The board may issue a temporary permit to an
5	individua	l who currently holds a multistate license issued by
6	another s	tate, territory, or county, provided that the
7	individua	<u>l:</u>
8	(1)	Completes an application on a form prescribed by the
9		board;
10	(2)	Pays all applicable fees to the board as prescribed by
11		administrative rules;
12	(3)	Provides proof of a valid and unencumbered multistate
13		license in another state, territory, or country by way
14		of a Nursys license verification report as prescribed
15		by administrative rules. For purposes of this
16		subsection, a "multistate license" means a license to
17		practice as a licensed practical nurse or registered
18		nurse issued by a home state licensing board that
19		authorizes the licensed nurse to practice in all party
20		states under a multistate licensure privilege; and

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1	(4)	Submits to the board a certified copy of the self-
2		query report issued by the National Practitioner Data
3		Bank.
4	(c)	A temporary permit shall be issued only to an
5	applicant	who has been appointed or accepted employment with a
6	single he	alth care entity in the State listed in section 321-
7	<u>11(10).</u>	
8	<u>(d)</u>	Notwithstanding sections 457-7 and 457-8, an out-of-
9	state reg	istered nurse or licensed practical nurse may apply for
10	<u>a license</u>	to practice as a registered nurse or licensed
11	practical	nurse simultaneously with an application for a
12	temporary	permit based on the requirements of subsections (a)
13	and (b).	
14	<u>(e)</u>	A temporary permit shall be valid only for a period of
15	six month	s from the date of issuance; provided that if an out-
16	of-state	licensed practical nurse or registered nurse has
17	submitted	an application to practice as a licensed practical

7	(f) An application for a temporary permit shall be
8	approved within seven business days of the date the completed
9	application is received by the board; provided that all criteria
10	in subsections (a) or (b) have been met."
11	SECTION 2. Section 457-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
13	"(b) Licenses shall be granted either by:
14	(1) Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass
15	a written examination in nursing subjects as
16	determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage
17	of the examination and compliance with the applicable
18	requirements of this chapter and the rules of the
19	board, the board shall issue to the applicant a
20	license to practice nursing as a registered nurse; or

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1	(2)	Endorsement: The board may issue a license to
2		practice nursing as a registered nurse by endorsement
3		to an applicant who has been licensed as a registered
4		nurse under the laws of another state, territory, or
5		foreign country if the applicant has an unencumbered
6		license and, in the opinion of the board, the
7		applicant meets the qualifications required of
8		registered nurses in this State at the time of
9		graduation. [Pending verification of a valid,
10		unencumbered license from another state, territory, or
11		foreign country, a temporary permit may be issued for
12		employment with a Hawaii employer.]"
13	SECT	ION 3. Section 457-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
15	"(b)	Licenses shall be granted either by:
16	(1)	Examination: The applicant shall be required to pass
17		a written examination in nursing subjects as
18		determined by the board. Upon the applicant's passage
19		of the examination and compliance with the applicable
20		requirements of this chapter and the rules of the
21		board, the board shall issue to the applicant a



1 license to practice nursing as a licensed practical 2 nurse; or 3 Endorsement: The board may issue a license to (2) 4 practice nursing as a licensed practical nurse by 5 endorsement to any applicant who has been licensed as a licensed practical nurse, or a person entitled to 6 7 perform similar services under a different title, 8 under the laws of another state, territory, or foreign 9 country if the applicant has an unencumbered license 10 and, in the opinion of the board, the applicant meets the requirements for licensed practical nurses in this 11 12 State at the time of graduation. [Pending 13 verification of a valid, unencumbered license from 14 another state, territory, or foreign country, a 15 temporary permit may be issued for employment with a 16 Hawaii employer.]" 17 SECTION 4. Section 457-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended to read as follows: 19 "§457-13 Exceptions. This chapter does not prohibit: 20 (1) The furnishing of nursing assistance in an emergency;

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1	(2)	The practice of nursing that is incidental to the
2		program of study engaged in by students enrolled in
3		nursing education programs accredited by the board;
4	[(3)	The practice of nursing under a nonrenewable permit
5		by:
6		(A) A graduate of; or
7		(B) An applicant who has provided proof that the
8		applicant has completed the entire educational
9		curriculum required for graduation for a nursing
10		license from,
11		a school that is in or under the jurisdiction of the
12		United States, a territory, or a foreign jurisdiction
13		and whose accreditation is recognized by the board;
14		provided that following completion of (A) or (B), the
15		candidate takes the first licensing examination
16		scheduled by any board of nursing recognized by the
17		board and has submitted to the board an application
18		for a license to practice nursing in the State; and
19		provided further that the permit shall be valid for
20		three months or until the results of the licensing
21		examination are received by the board;]

2		another state who is employed by the United States or
3		any bureau, division, or agency thereof, while in the
4		discharge of the nurse's official duties;
5	[(5)]	(4) The practice of nursing in connection with
6		healing by prayer or spiritual means alone in
7		accordance with the tenets and practice of any well
8		recognized church or religious denomination, provided
9		that no person practicing such nursing claims to
10		practice as a registered nurse or a licensed practical
11		nurse; [or]
12	[-(6) -]	(5) The administration of oral and topical medication
13		and in emergency situations, other premeasured
14		medication, by school health aides as provided in
15		section 302A-853[-]; or
16	(6)	The practice of nursing by a nurse licensed in another
17		state, territory, or country who is accompanying a
18		patient or patients from out of state for less than
19		two weeks and who is not employed by or affiliated
20		with a health care entity in the State."

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1	SECTION 5. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
2	may adopt interim rules to establish fees for the administration
3	of this Act. All fees collected shall be deposited into the
4	credit of the compliance resolution fund established pursuant to
5	section 26-9(o), Hawaii Revised Statutes. Fees assessed shall
6	be used to carry out the purposes of this Act without regard to
7	chapters 91 or 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes; provided that:
8	(1) The department shall hold at least one public hearing
9	prior to the adoption of interim rules; and
10	(2) The interim rules shall be effective for no more than
11	one year after their adoption.
12	SECTION 6. The department of commerce and consumer affairs
13	may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76,
14	Hawaii Revised Statutes, including one full-time permanent
15	office assistant, for the purposes of this Act.
16	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
18	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
19	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
20	year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the compliance resolution
21	fund.



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SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the compliance 1 2 resolution fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so 3 4 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to implement the regulation of nurses as required by this Act. 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 6 of commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act. 7 8 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on December 31, 11 2050.



Report Title:

Nurses; Registered Nurses; Practical Nurses; Board of Nursing; Licenses; Endorsement; Temporary Permits; Exceptions

Description:

Allows the Board of Nursing to issue temporary permits for sixmonth periods to registered nurses and practical nurses licensed in another jurisdiction under certain circumstances, and excepts from license requirements nurses who are licensed in another state, territory, or country accompanying a patient from out-ofstate for a period of less than two weeks and not employed or affiliated with a health care facility in the State. Allows an out-of-state registered nurse or licensed practical nurse to simultaneously apply for a license to practice and a temporary permit, and in such circumstances, extends the validity of temporary permit to until the Board approves the application to practice. Effective 12/31/2050. (SD1)

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
